

We pray for them in their daily work.


Grant to them an increase in spiritual gifts and grace, so they may be prepared for the tasks at hand.

### A New Corpus Christi Thematic Goal

Hello brothers and sisters in Christ! This week, I'd like to take a few minutes to share with you a new thematic goal for the parish we're kicking off this weekend. To be right up front, here's the goal: Stirring our parishioners and potential parishioners, both those coming to Church and those not, to new faith in Christ through Holy Spirit infused encounters with Jesus.

Back in 2016, the Archdiocese of Detroit had a great conference featuring Pat Lencioni and an organization he works with called *Amazing Parish* that really brought wonderful blessings to priests and parish staffs. Personally, I found Pat's concept of a leadership team to be great and have been blessed to work with a great leadership team at Corpus Christi since July of 2019, shortly after Fr. Don passed me the baton. Pat defines the leadership team as, "a small group of people who are collectively responsible for achieving a common objective for their organization."

The leadership team currently consists of Sr. Therese MacKinnon, Valerie Berry, Curtis Simpson, Doug Buday and myself. The primary objective the team is always seeking to achieve is to help Corpus Christi continue to passionately pursue living out our parish mission statement, which is "we strive to radiate the presence of Jesus Christ in our parish and community and invite others to join us on our journey." I love our parish mission statement and if I had to summarize it in five words or less, I would say, we exist to share Jesus.

So, what Pat Lencioni taught us back in 2016 about leadership teams is that utilizing a thematic goal can help organizations continue to have a special emphasis on something that helps the organization continue to passionately pursue its mission. Pat defines a thematic goal as "a rally cry that is singular, qualitative and temporary. Singular means that there is a very clear focus of the goal and its desired outcome. Qualitative means that it's about quality and not quantity, the goal isn't measured by numbers (though they can be helpful) but by the qualitative impact it has on an organization. Temporary means that the goal has a lifespan, Pat recommends anywhere from 3 -12 months for thematic goals. This current goal is slated to be a 12-month goal. So back to the goal!

# AT A GLANCE: SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING RECERTIFICATION AND NEW TRAINING

The best approach to addressing abuse is to prevent it from occurring in the first place.

The Archdiocese of Detroit has updated its Safe Environment policies. For compliance, adherence to these policies is required in every office, parish, school, and Catholic agency within the AOD to protect – especially – children and vulnerable adults from sexual abuse. Requiring all volunteers and employees to take the training empowers more men and women to know the warning signs and helps them become part of the solution of preventing abuse. Running background checks for ALL employees and volunteers can help deter criminals and sexual predators from participating in any parish or school ministry or event. If a criminal understands that they will have to undergo a background check, they will less likely attempt to volunteer.

The AOD uses Virtus, an online platform for all training, monitoring, and data collection.

# Recertification is required for all existing volunteers and employees who completed *Protecting God's Children* (PGC) before January 1, 2020.

- Recertification must be completed by November 1, 2023.
- All 100,000+ AOD-registered Virtus users were sent an email (from Virtus) in late June and early July with links for recertification.
- If you did not receive an email about your recertification, log into your existing Virtus account. You should not create a new account if you have taken Protecting God's Children in the past. If you do not remember your username or password, Virtus offers a username and password recovery option at bit.ly/Virtus\_Account\_Recovery. If you have difficulties accessing your account, contact the Virtus Help Desk (helpdesk@virtus.org / 888-847-8870) or send an email to protectchildren@aod.org.
- Once you have logged into your Virtus account you should see the assigned training under the Home tab / Current Training.
- The self-paced modules (Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults) are entirely online and take approximately 2.5 hours to complete.
- You can stop and start as you need to complete training at your convenience.

## Existing Volunteers who have NEVER taken a PGC session before:

- A PGC session must be completed by November 1, 2023.
- The self-paced modules (Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults) are entirely online and take approximately 2.5 hours to complete.
- Register online at bit.ly/Virtus\_Registration
- You can stop and start as you need to complete training at your convenience.

## **New Employees and New Recurrent Volunteers**

- All new employees and new recurrent adult volunteers must register on the Virtus platform (bit.ly/Virtus\_Registration)
- You must be certified before commencing your role.
- You are required to register for a live session of Protecting God's Children training (either in person or by Zoom) and the online self-paced Vulnerable Adults training will be assigned to you.

# New occasional adult volunteers (1-3 times per year volunteer), even those who do not serve in a direct role working with youth, must be trained

- You must register on the Virtus platform and complete training before volunteering (bit.ly/Virtus\_Registration)
- You may complete your certification either -
  - entirely online at your convenience with the self-paced training modules for Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults, or
  - by attending an in-person or live Zoom session for Protecting God's Children and completing the self-paced Vulnerable Adults module online.

# **Background Checks**

Parishes or schools are responsible for running background checks through the Michigan State Police ICHAT portal.

- An annual background check is now required for ALL clergy, employees, and recurrent adult volunteers.
- A biennial background check is required for occasional volunteers and those contracted by parishes and schools.
- Contact the Office of Child and Youth Protection for assistance running background checks on employees and recurrent adult volunteers who have not lived in Michigan for at least 7 years (protectchildren@aod.org / 313-237-5826).
