



The Oil of Devotion

This weekend, in Matthew 25:1-13, we read of an important parable Jesus began with these words, "The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom." (Mt 25:1) The parable is about living as disciples who are ready for the coming of the Lord. Should we be alive when the second coming of Jesus happens, we'll want to be ready. Should the moment when our lives on this earth comes to an end happen prior to the second coming, we'll want to be ready. As disciples of Jesus growing in our friendship day by day with Jesus, we want to be ever ready to be attentive to His presence.

In the parable, those who had run out of oil were not ready. The oil in a candle feeds the wick which in turn burns the oil-soaked wick. When there's no more oil, the wick has nothing left for the flame to burn, and so the flame is extinguished. The word devotion is beautiful. One of the ways good the good old *Miriam-Webster Dictionary* defines it is "being ardently dedicated and loyal." If we think of our faith as a flame, then the acts of our devotion, steadily carried out through our days, keep feeding the flame of our faith with the oil of devotion.

Our rhythms of prayer can certainly change given the circumstances of our lives. Yet, ideally by grace, there is an ever growing first-passion love in our hearts for God. It's a grace to receive a passion for God as our first love. This grace empowers us hunger for the practice of affectionate devotion to God leading us to find time again and again to get alone with God and pour ourselves into worship and contemplation of God. Fascinatingly, Jesus teaches us that "indeed, the Father seeks such worshipers." (Jn 4:23) If the Father seeks such worshipers, it's more than safe to say...the Father is ready to grant the graces needed to produce such worshipers. Anyone interested?

"Black Catholic History Month"
During the month of November
we remember and celebrate hundreds of
Black Saints and notable Black Catholics

This week we share the story of Father Norman "The Duke" Dukette



Fr. DuKette was born on November 11, 1890, the 18th of 27 siblings, to John and Letitia DuKette in Washington, D.C. At the age of 17, his family moved to Detroit, MI, and he shared his desire to become a priest. He wrote many letters requesting admission to diocesan seminaries and religious orders but was consistently denied admission.

In 1916, his persistence was rewarded with acceptance to Loras Academy. His expenses were covered by a generous widow who had taken an interest in the young man upon meeting him in church.

Fr. DuKette graduated from Loras Academy in 1918 and continued his studies at Columbia College until his graduation in 1922.

After a bout with pneumonia temporarily halted his studies, Fr. DuKette persisted in his pursuit of the priesthood and was ordained in the Cathedral of Detroit on February 7, 1926. His ordination was marked by a large celebration that saw 200 alumni from Columbia College in attendance to honor his achievement. He was the first black Catholic priest ordained by the Archdiocese of Detroit.

His first pastoral work began with the founding of the Church of St. Benedict the Moor in Detroit in 1927, then Fr. DuKette was sent to Flint, MI to establish a parish for black Catholics in 1929. He would remain in Flint for the rest of his life, creating the Christ the King Parish out of next to nothing. Fr. Dukette shepherded more than 100 families through their faith, as fiercely devoted to his flock as they were to him.

An example of this devotion occurred on a cold winter night when a man called upon Fr. DuKette. He found the priest bundled in his greatcoat and shivering as he read his prayers without heat. The man asked if Fr. DuKette had run out of coal for heat, but the priest replied that he was saving what little he had for Sunday Mass the next day so the attendees would be warm and comfortable.

Fr. DuKette retired in 1970 at the age of 80 and received an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Loras College. He was also honored by the Black Catholic Clergy Caucus as the oldest black priest in the United States in 1975.

Fr. Dukette passed away in 1980 at the age of 89.



The Miraculous Medal





The devotion commonly known as that of the Miraculous Medal owes its origin to Sister Catherine (Zoe) Labore, a member of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, to whom the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared three separate times in the Sisters' chapel in Paris, France. The first of these apparitions occurred July 18, 1830. the sec-

ond November 27, and the third a short time later. The Blessed Virgin appeared standing on a globe. As if from rings set with precious stones dazzling rays of light were emitted from her fingers. These, she said, were symbols of the graces which would be bestowed on all who asked for them. Around the figure appeared an oval frame bearing in golden letters the prayer: "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee". The reference to "Mary conceived without sin" supports the dogma of the Immaculate Conception of Mary referring to Mary being sinless, "full of grace," and "blessed among women" (Lk. 1:28). The dogma of the Immaculate Conception was proclaimed 24 years later in 1854, and then confirmed when Mary appeared to St. Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, France, in 1858.


On the back of the medal appeared the letter M, surmounted by a cross, with a crossbar beneath it, representing the closeness of Mary with Jesus and the fact that Mary leads us to Jesus. Under that was the heart of Jesus surrounded by a crown of thorns and the heart of Mary pierced by a sword. Circling the medal were twelve stars representing the apostles and our call to apostolic zeal. At the second and third visions a command was given to have a medal struck after the model revealed, and a promise of great graces was made to those who wear it when blessed. On November 27 we celebrate the feast of the Miraculous Medal and on November 28 the feast of St. Catherine Labore. Traditionally the novena of the Miraculous Medal is said nine days prior to December 8, the feast of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Medals and prayers will be available for the novena. 




