



Prepare Your Heart: Jesus, the Gift, Is on the Way

Advent 2023 at Corpus Christi

Jesus is intimately in union with the Church, his body & bride, and guides the Church under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. (Mt 16:18) Through the Church, Jesus has given us a rhythm of seasons in our prayer life that we believe flows from a divine pedagogy. Like Mary, "who treasured all these things in her heart" (Luke 2:19), the liturgical cycle which the liturgical calendar gives us helps us to continue to mediate on the mysteries of our faith in Jesus in a way that helps us to continue to grow in our union with God. Now, we come to Advent 2023 at Corpus Christi.

Advent is a joyful penitential season of anticipation. The Church describes it this way in The Catechism of the Catholic Church "when the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present the ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming" (CCC, 524) The English word

advent comes to us from a combination of two Latin words ad and venire, we see that **ad** means **to or towards** and that **venire** means **to come, to arrive or the coming.**

In the season of Advent, we prepare to celebrate the first coming of Christ at Christmas, and yet by preparing to celebrate his birth, we are invited by Jesus to enter into an ardent desire that our lives would be more wholly rooted in Jesus and shining his presence ever brighter. Through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, three beautiful biblical renewal of the mind faith practices (at the heart of penance is the idea of having a change of mind) we lean into the grace of ardent desire for the Lord that leads to greater union with the Lord who continues to desire us.

This year's Advent theme at Corpus Christi is: *Prepare Your Heart: Jesus, the Gift, Is on the Way.* Through a whole-hearted engagement with Jesus on the advent journey, the grace of new awe and wonder in our lives will arise as the Lord prepares us for renewal and new life in Him as we celebrate the mystery of Christmas.





At November's Generations of Faith Session, 60 adults and 19 young people in grades 1-12 grew in "wisdom and grace" as they learned more about the Eucharist, especially Jesus as the Bread of Life. The adults focused on the Real Presence of Jesus in the bread and wine (Body and Blood,

Soul and Divinity) by reflecting on the words of Jesus in the Gospel of John 6:48 – 59 and the words of Bishop Robert Barron who explained the Church's teaching via two videos. The children in grades 1-3 learned a song about the Eucharist which they sang for the whole group!

Are you a Witness?

Christianity is about something that happened, people witnessed it and shared the story of what they saw and heard. Our faith has been passed down to us by individuals like you and I. They were normal everyday people with families, jobs, friends; doing the best they could; their lives were routine until they had their first encounter with Jesus. Someone witnesses to them about Jesus- that He loves us, about heaven, about hell, about forgiveness, about mercy and hope! Who was that first person to tell you?

Remember when you found out that Jesus loves you all the time, no matter what? We all heard our first story about Jesus because someone shared their belief with you, they passed on to us what they knew about Jesus. For some of us our lives were changed at that moment, for others a seed was planted that God then let flourish as we allowed in our heart.



(Practicing) Catholic - Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

Memento Mori

Just this week, my husband and I signed our wills, and the lawyer was careful to couch our transaction in gentle, abstract language: "When we lose you" she kept saying, instead of "When you die."

It's very uncomfortable to dwell on our death. But the Christian life does not just encourage us to do so: it demands that we do.

I once came upon a prayer consecrating the last two hours of life to the Blessed Mother. I have since found variations of the prayer online with different phrasing, but the sentiment of them all is the same: let me not be caught sleeping. Let me be ready.

"You can't do all your homework at the end," a deacon who ministers to the dying once told me. "Good Friday is waiting in the wings for all of us."

I think of that a lot when I don't particularly feel like praying, when I think I'm too busy to go to confession or when feelings of resentment fester inside me on Sunday mornings as I pack my family off to church. All our good deeds are like polluted rags, says the prophet. We have all withered like leaves.

You can't do all your homework at the end. God is faithful. Are we?


