I have some questions for you younger ones and some for you older ones.


So, who is between the ages of 2 and 5?

Older than 9?


How many like to hear stories or read stories?

[showing the cover of a large, home-made book with poster-board pages]




Have you ever heard of this one? I.I.A.A.Y.L.? (no prompting from you adults!)


No? Well, then, let me tell you this story! [showing page 1 of book]

When you make something you want to keep it safe, maybe protect from others so they don't mess it all up.


If it is really special you might even say "I love it!" So it is with God.

So, it looks something like our stable here in the back of church?


If Jesus was born today it would be like us saying Jesus was born in our garage!

Because we use his birth to count the years on our calendar


Because he is the most important person who ever lived


IIAAYL, that is
