


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

Prophets of Justice

during a time of military successes, prosperity and wealth (700's BCE) yet the Israelites were breaking the Sinai Covenant

Samaria = capital of Israel; Jerusalem = capital of Judah

Amos Micah

The person:

**A shepherd and dresser of sycamores (fig-like fruit)

- **Small town in Judah
- **Not a professional prophet

Audience:

**people at the great cult center of Bethel, just over the border in Israel

**the wealthy and powerful

Message: essence of religion is social justice

Style: blunt, even offensive

Added later: epilogue at the end of the book ("I

will not destroy the house of David")

At Mass: two Sundays (Cycle B and C) 2:6-10 and

7:10-17 and the 13th week (7 days)

Evidence against the covenant breakers:

The person:

- **small town in Judah
- **preached in Judah
- ** Not a professional prophet

Audience:

- **the wealthy and powerful
- **Rulers of the house of Israel

Message: virtue lies in the practice of Justice (HOW? "You have been told what the Lord requires of you: Do right, love goodness, walk humbly with God" 6:8)

Added later: Chapters 4 & 5 ("The People to be Restored")

At Mass: one Sunday in Advent (Cycle C) 5:1-4a and the 15th week (3 days)

Chapter 3: 9 Proclaim to the fortresses of Ashdod and to the fortresses of Egypt:

"Assemble yourselves on the mountains of Samaria; see the great unrest within her

and the oppression among her people."

¹⁰ "They do not know how to do right," declares the LORD, "who store up in their fortresses what they have plundered and looted."

¹¹Therefore this is what the

Sovereign LORD says: "An enemy will overrun your land, pull down your strongholds

and plunder your fortresses."

Chapter 4: 1 Hear this word, you cows of Bashan [a fertile region known for rich pastures] on Mount Samaria, you women who oppress the poor and crush the needy and say to your husbands, "Bring us some drinks!"

² The Sovereign LORD has sworn by his holiness: "The time will surely come when you will be taken away with hooks, the last of you with fishhooks. [a]
³ You will each go straight out through breaches in the wall, and you will be cast out toward Harmon, [b]" declares the LORD.

Chapter 8: 4 Hear this, you who trample the needy and do away with the poor of the land, 5 saying, "When will the New Moon be over that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath be ended that we may market wheat?"— skimping on the measure, boosting the price and cheating with dishonest scales, 6 buying the poor with silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, selling even the sweepings with the wheat.

Chapter 6:7 Therefore you will be among the first to go into exile; your feasting and lounging will end. ⁸ The Sovereign LORD has sworn by himself—the LORD God Almighty declares: "I abhor the pride of Jacob and detest his fortresses; I will deliver up the city and everything in it."... ¹⁴ Beware, I am raising up against you, O house of Israel, say I, the Lord of hosts, a nation that shall oppress you.

Micah

Chapter 1:5 All this is because of Jacob's transgression, because of the sins of the people of Israel.

What is Jacob's transgression? Is it not Samaria?

What is Judah's high place? Is it not Jerusalem?

6 "Therefore I will make Samaria a heap of rubble, a place for planting vineyards.

I will pour her stones into the valley and lay bare her foundations.

7 All her idols will be broken to pieces; all her temple gifts will be burned with fire; I will destroy all her images.

Since she gathered her gifts from the wages of prostitutes, as the wages of prostitutes they will again be used."

Chapter 3: 9 Hear this, you leaders of Jacob, you rulers of Israel, who despise justice and distort all that is right;

10 who build Zion with bloodshed, and Jerusalem with wickedness.

11 Her leaders judge for a bribe, her priests teach for a price, and her prophets tell fortunes for money.

Yet they look for the LORD's support and say,

"Is not the LORD among us? No disaster will come upon us."

12 Therefore because of you,

Zion will be plowed like a field,

Jerusalem will become a heap of rubble,

the temple hill a mound overgrown with thickets.

Chapter 2: 1 Woe to those who plan iniquity, to those who plot evil on their beds!

At morning's light they carry it out because it is in their power to do it. ²They covet fields and seize them, and houses, and take them. They defraud people of their homes; they rob them of their inheritance.

³Therefore, the LORD says: "I am planning disaster against this people, from which you cannot save yourselves. You will no longer walk proudly, for it will be a time of calamity.

Restoration Chapter 5:1 "But you,

Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans^[b] of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."... ³ He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth; he shall be peace.
