

Have you ever seen a symphony orchestra? I went with a friend of mine to my first orchestra at St. Ben's in St. Joseph, Minn. It was stunning. It was the Minnesota Orchestra, I think. There were over 100 musicians. I was dumbfounded to see all of the violins stroking up and down at the same time. The cello's were also in time with one another but not in time with the violins. The same was true for all of the other stringed instruments. Seeing the brass counting the beat with the movement of their horns, in time with one another, was amazing. And then watching the percussion section and how they all used the drum sticks as if they were linked together so every drum beat was exact. After decades I am still amazed at the sound and the wonder of an orchestra. If you have not gone lately, or taken a child to see an orchestra, I encourage you to do so. I would like to address our younger Knights this month about the benefits of Long-Term Care coverage.

Younger is a relative term in the Knights, but if you are over 30 but less than 60 years old you should consider a long-term care policy with the Knights. Many Knights over age 60 are relieved that they wisely obtained their policies at an earlier age or are ruing the fact they didn't get coverage before it became cost prohibitive.

If you plan to retire with any assets and use those assets to benefit your spouse or family, you should have a long-term care policy. The policies allow you to protect assets in the event you need assistance later in life with daily needs. The Knights allow you to lock in a premium with an inflation rider that will adjust your benefits level to meet the costs in the future without additional outlays. For a 30 year old you could purchase only \$50 of daily benefit with a 5% inflation rider for a modest premium that will never rise and have a monthly benefit of \$13,490 per month by the time you are 80!

Long-term care policies are underwritten based on your health, and you most likely will never be any healthier than you are today. Coverage is inexpensive at your current age compared to 5 to 10 years in the future. And in my experience, anyone financially responsible that can budget for the cost of long-term care will eventually attempt to get a policy. Give me a call today to get actual costs for the coverage needed to allow you to ensure you can live the way you wish in your later years. Coverage also allows you to leave the legacy you want for your loved ones, without the risk that money you want to leave to them will go to the nursing home instead.



Nancy decided to run as President during COVID when the Lady Knights were recruiting for board members. "I was thinking about it but reluctant to say yes. As I pulled up for 'parking lot Mass', I noticed I was next to the current VP. I rolled down my window and said, 'Ok God, I'm in!"

Nancy's work with the Lady Knights strengthens her relationship with God. She states, "there is a definite hands-on effort to help those in need. This is verified by the gratefulness of those groups receiving blankets and financial donations." The group also celebrates first wedding anniversaries and the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation. "Working on these projects brings a special focus on God's love. I would be remiss if I didn't mention that the most important thing we do is pray and support one another."

Nancy encourages other women in the SJTW parish to

join the Lady Knights. "You don't have to be married to a Knight, retired, or know how to bake! As Father Mike would say, 'Who doesn't need more prayers and hugs!"
