We hope this message finds you and your families doing well as we enter this Advent season.



When planning for retirement, many people fail to consider one important and potentially significant expense...the cost of long-term care services.

The average cost of nursing home care is quickly approaching \$97,000 a year according to WhatCareCosts.com/KnightsOfColumbus. And that's just for one person. If both partners need care, a retirement nest egg could be depleted quickly. - Would you have access to the funds you need? Or would you have to sell assets, cash in stocks, or dip into 401(k) or other savings accounts?
- Which asset would you use to pay for long-term care services?


