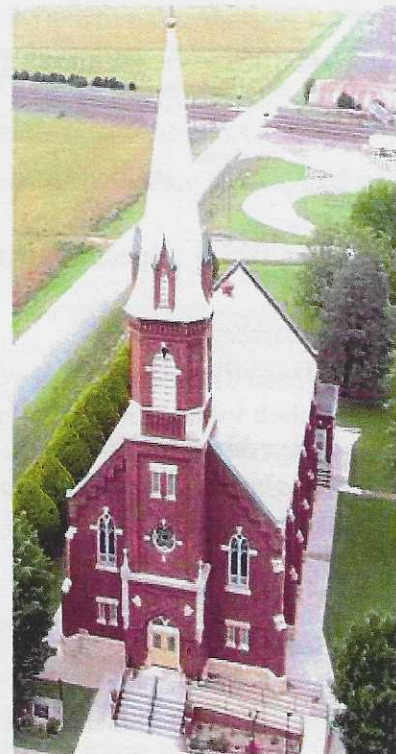

Saints Peter & Paul

Why are saints Peter and Paul celebrated together?

Tradition holds that both saints faced persecution for their beliefs and were ultimately martyred in Rome. Peter is said to have been crucified upside down, while Paul, a Roman citizen, was beheaded. The celebration of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29th is a significant event in the Christian liturgical calendar, marking the commemoration of two of the most influential figures in early Christianity. Their lives, though distinct, intertwine in ways that have had a profound and lasting impact on the faith and its followers.
