








Also new to our staff this year, heading up our youth Confirmation prep sessions, is Sam Johnson. Sam moved back to the Manitowoc area just over a year ago, comes with great passion for the Catholic Faith, and a desire to share it with our youth. These preparation sessions are for both our Catholic school and public school youth.

Our middle school formation is "Edge." High school programs are "Life Teen" and "Summit" plus the "Dead Theologians Society." Middle school and high school faith formation is led by Elizabeth Gruenke. Elizabeth has been with us for a number of years and is doing a great

ministry reaching our youth.



The Office of Pro-Life of the Bishop's Conference (USCCB) is very concerned about a piece of legislation that would make abortion on demand at any stage of pregnancy widely available across the country while limiting the ability of states to place restrictions on abortion. This is a "Dark Day in America". Your action needed more than ever! The House of Representatives voted to pass the most radical abortion bill ever. The so-called Women's Health Protection Act, H.R. 3755, would:


- Allow abortion on demand nationwide throughout EVERY STAGE of pregnancy

Of those present, all but one House Democrat (Rep. Henry Cuellar of Texas) voted for the bill and all House Republicans voted against. In his statement responding to this vote, Archbishop Joseph Naumann, Chairman of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities, called this bill "the most extreme pro-abortion bill our nation has ever seen."

Time to take action once again. To step out and contact our elected representatives. Go to this link: www.votervoice.net/USCCB/Campaigns/88618/Respond to email our elected officials. Thank our Representative for voting against H.R. 3755 and our two Senators to strongly urge their opposition to the Senate version of this bill (S. 1975) when it comes up for a vote. There will also be a postcard option available at our worship sites for those that do not have access to electronic means. Let us continue to make a strong for our faith and belief that life begins at conception and we need to do all we can to preserve that life, including ending abortion. Make your voice heard today.

Another opportunity to take part is the 40 Days of Life. This is an internationally coordinated 40-day local campaign aimed attending abortion through prayer and fasting, community outreach and a peaceful all-day vigil near local abortion businesses. Here in Manitowoc, this is taking place at the Public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood on 1100 South 30th Street. For more information go to *crossingmanitowoc.org/home*.

Thank you for your action, and for all you do to proclaim the Gospel of Life. Please pray today and every given Sunday that our nation and its leaders will fully embrace this Gospel. Since October is the month of the rosary, please consider adding this intention too when you pray.



# Catholic group plans to add 'Wisconsin Way' to its list of walking pilgrimages

ALLOUEZ — Walking pilgrimages to religious sites have been a popular way of expressing and building one's faith and connection to God for centuries. In the Diocese of Green Bay, spiritual journeys such as the annual 21-mile Walk to Mary, from the National Shrine of St. Joseph in De Pere to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help in Champion in May, have attracted thousands.

A new opportunity to experience this physical act of faith will soon be available, courtesy of the Modern Catholic Pilgrim based in San Diego. Will Peterson, founder of Modern Catholic Pilgrim, visited the diocese in late August to make a 130-mile walking pilgrimage from the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help in Champion to the Basilica of the National Shrine of Mary Help of Christians in Hubertus. The journey is known as "The Wisconsin Way."

The Wisconsin Way walking pilgrimage is a journey first promoted by Fr. Andrew Kurz, administrator of St. Paul Parish

in Plainfield. Fr. Kurz created his own walking pilgrimage from Champion to Hubertus, also known as Holy Hill, in 2013. He told The Compass that it was his hope to ignite a walking pilgrimage movement in this country.

Peterson, whose Modern Catholic Pilgrim project leads walking pilgrimages in Kentucky and California, plans to add The Wisconsin Way to its offerings. He decided to scout the route before promoting the pilgrimage.

"My plan for this first pilgrimage is to get a sense of the route and to connect with our initial hospitality network members along the way," Peterson said.

CHILTON — Approximately 12 miles separate Chilton Area Catholic School and Divine Savior School in Kiel, so it would make sense for the new principals at both campuses to build a working relationship. No problem for Samantha Meyers and Martha Holst. They more than have it covered.

## 5 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

#### St. Therese of Lisieux

- Born on Jan. 2, 1873, she was named Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin.
- 2 Thérèse experienced a childhood call to religious life and entered Lisieux's Carmelite monastery at age 15. Her five sisters all joined religious orders.
- 3 Thérèse received the religious name of Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face.
- 4 Her older sister, Pauline, became prioress of the same monastery. Recognizing her sister's spiritual gifts, Pauline told Thérèse to write down her spiritual memoirs. These were published after Thérèse's death (Sept. 30, 1897) as "The Story of a Soul."
- 5 Thérèse's advice on trusting and loving Jesus became known as "the Little Way." The "Little Flower" was canonized in 1925. Her feast is Oct. 1.



## Good St. Joseph at work in our diocese

Dear friends and followers of Jesus:

Imost exactly two years ago, in this column, I shared with you two goals that my leadership team and I had set for our diocese for the next five years. One goal centered

Bishop David Ricken around increasing the number of missionary disciples in our diocese and the other goal centered around increasing the number of seminarians. Brothers and sisters, there is some very good news to report about our vocations goal to call forth and form 30 seminarians to be missionary leaders in the priesthood by 2025. The Lord is hearing your prayers!

You may also remember that, on March 19, 2020, here in the Diocese of Green Bay, we began a year dedicated to St. Joseph. Before our diocesan Year of St. Joseph concluded, Pope Francis declared that 2021 would also be dedicated to St. Joseph as we recognize the 150th anniversary of his being named patron of the universal church.

Over the past 18 months, then, we have prayed our diocesan Prayer to St. Joseph.

Among the intentions of this prayer is a request to St. Joseph for his assistance with vocations:

"With Mary, you raised Jesus the High Priest. "You know our need for priests. "Please raise up good and holy priests from our families to serve the people of our diocese.

"May our children and grandchildren hear and say 'yes' to the call of Jesus, just as you and Mary did."

Has St. Joseph ever been at work in this last school year! Last year, five young men entered our new pre-seminary studies year in the diocese. They lived at the Holy Name of Jesus House of Formation at the former convent at St. Matthew Church in Allouez. During this "Kairos Year," these young men spent time praying and living in community, learning to listen and respond to God's call for them. I am pleased to report that all five of those men have decided to move forward and apply to the seminary. They have all been accepted and are now beginning their studies in the next few days! In addition, this year another seven young men are beginning their Kairos Year.

I have noticed over the years that St. Joseph always answers prayers so quietly and so completely that he often goes beyond our expectations. Since all of you started praying for an increase in "yesses" to the vocation to the priesthood, through the intercession of St. Joseph, a little over a year and a half ago, 12 young men are now engaged in seminary and pre-seminary studies, leaving us with a total of 17 men in formation! These men were not here before we started the prayer!
