

HOW YOU TRANSFORM LIVES AT TULANE

Often, priests get asked the question: "What's your favorite part of being a priest?" Maybe you've wondered that as well. What moves me the most to witness as a priest is **conversion**.

In my mind, there's nothing more beautiful than helping someone be *transformed* into the person God is calling him or her to be. That's why I love working with college students. There's a lot of negativity out there about the younger generation—millennials. But the college age millennials I work with never cease to amaze me, especially when they are transformed and their hearts are set on fire. Let me give you a few examples.

For instance, the other night, at the height of Mardi Gras season, I had students come to me begging to have a Holy Hour of prayer after Sunday Mass. I didn't have anything scheduled because I assumed everyone wanted to be at the parades that night—and don't get me wrong, they had gone to parades too—but they were committed to prayer. I was so impressed to watch 20 young people sit in the chapel in silence for an hour at night. But this is normal for them. And why do they do it? Because they've fallen in love.

Another example: the students with whom I went on mission to Honduras this January. Over the course of 7 days I watched and listened as they went through a series of intense interior changes, growing in compassion, self-awareness, generosity and love for God and neighbor.

Or, for instance, a young man who went to SEEK2017 and while in prayer, couldn't stop thinking about all his friends on campus and how he wanted to reach out to them. Or another young man who is now discerning the priesthood. Or a young woman who gave up a year of her life to work with immigrants in Houston, Texas. Or the young people now in RCIA preparing for Baptism. Or the students who are now coming to me wanting to be confirmed—realizing that they now want to live out their faith with intensity and committment.

These are the everyday conversions and transformations I see at Tulane Catholic. **They simply** would not happen without your generous support. Thank you for changing their lives... and mine.
