This Week's Reflection Reflexión De Esta Semana

False Humility?

It's been months since Easter and it's a long way to Christmas, but there seems to be a lot of rejoicing in today's readings. Isaiah talks about rejoicing with Jerusalem. The Gospel shows the disciples rejoicing when they came back from visiting towns to tell about the Kingdom. St. Paul is happy to be suffering for Christ. So what is the reason for such joy?

The readings make clear that it is not because of what the people

of Jerusalem did, or even what miracles Jesus' disciples performed. Isaiah talks about what God will do for the people, how "the Lord's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14). Jesus tells his disciples not to rejoice that they cast out demons; no, they should "rejoice because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). In other words, we are to rejoice over all the Lord has done for us, not what we have done for him.


Does that sound like false humility? Like someone receiving an Oscar who says, "I wasn't that good—it was all that my director, my producers, my wife and children, and my dog Snoopy did." No, when we do anything for others, we can honestly say that God does the real work. Knowing that frees us from expecting everyone to be happy, everything we do for others to be successful. When our offer of help is rejected, our prayers for a sick friend don't seem to be working, or our good advice is ridiculed, we can be confident

that God has something else planned. Instead of being discouraged, we can trust that God's plan is working in ways we just can't see.

Paul has a similar theme in the second reading. You would think he would be proud of all the converts he made or the people he cured. He boasts only about his suffering because that is how he is most like Jesus. He sees all of his accomplishments as the work of God, and he knows that the greatest thing Jesus did was to die for us. All three readings remind us that what changes our lives and changes the world is not how hard we work or how holy we are; what really makes the difference is how much God loves us. That is the real reason to rejoice.

Presume sólo de su sufrimiento porque así es como más se parece a Jesús. Ve todos sus logros como obra de Dios y sabe que lo más grande que hizo Jesús fue morir por nosotros. Las tres lecturas nos recuerdan que lo que cambia nuestras vidas y cambia el mundo no es cuánto nos esforzamos ni cuán santos seamos; lo que realmente marca la diferencia es cuánto nos ama Dios. Esa es la verdadera razón para regocijarnos.




Prayer for Our Troops

SUMMER CHANT WORKSHOP: NOTATION AND INTERPRETATION

MONDAY JULY 21 - FRIDAY JULY 25, 2025

SAINT MEINRAD ARCHABBEY

This workshop is designed for directors of liturgical music and singers in parish liturgies who have some background in music. Sessions during the week will focus on how to read the earliest sources of chant and interpret their notation. Daily rehearsals will cover the differences in singing chant from other styles of sacred music. Participants will also be introduced to the church modes and how and why the melodies take the shape they do. These insights will allow participants to uncover the spiritual meaning of chant and sing with a better understanding and intention. Br. John Glasenapp and Br.
