

## Mission Statement As Catholics committed to a


sacramental life, we are called to be disciples of Christ and help one another as we journey to Heaven under the mantle of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Communion of Saints.

#### This Week's Reflection

#### Reflexión De Esta Semana

#### Miracles of Faith

Besides being cured, what do Nathan (first reading) and the leper who thanked Jesus (Gospel) have in common? Both of them began to believe. Nathan proclaims Israel's God to be the only God; he even wants to worship the Lord in his own country. The only leper who returned to thank Jesus was "glorifying God in a loud voice" (Luke 17:15). It makes me wonder, what miracles do we see that help us grow in faith?

For an answer, we can look at a second thing they had in common: they both asked for help. Sometimes we get caught up in self-sufficiency mode, thinking we have to handle all our problems by ourselves. We may miss out on good solutions by not asking for help. Help often comes from someone who shows us a way through our problems, without solving them for us. Perhaps if we talk about the problem with another person, the solution will become obvious to us. If you think asking for help is a sign of weakness, you may be missing a chance for God to act through one of your friends and give you support. And, of course, you can ask God for help in prayer, giving God the chance to speak to your heart with the answer or the encouragement you need.

Miracles don't just happen to other people. We may have friends who help us in times of need or inspire us with their faith, but we have to decide to make a leap of faith ourselves. The third thing that Nathan and the leper did in common was express their faith. You can spend your whole life thinking that you are a Christian, but if you never express that faith, it will be no more than a theory. Scientists work with theories all the time, but until they write out the math or do the experiments, the theory is never proven. St. Paul in the second reading, for example, was suffering in prison, but he didn't mind because his suffering demonstrated the importance of Jesus' message to him. So he wrote from prison in the hope that other Christians would be encouraged in their faith. Perhaps you know of someone who inspired you with their faithfulness and dedication. Having a friend who helps us grow in faith can be a very nice miracle indeed.

#### Milagros de la Fe

Además de la curación, ¿qué tienen en común Natán en la primera lectura y el leproso que dio gracias a Jesús en el Evangelio? Ambos comenzaron a creer. Natán proclama que el Dios de Israel es el único Dios; incluso desea adorar al Señor en su tierra. El único leproso que regresó para agradecer a Jesús estaba "alabando a Dios en voz alta" (Lucas 17,15). Me pregunto: ¿qué milagros vemos que nos ayudan a crecer en la fe?

Para encontrar la respuesta, podemos considerar otra cosa que tenían en común: ambos pidieron ayuda. A veces nos dejamos llevar por la autosuficiencia, pensando que tenemos que resolver todos los problemas solos. Podemos perder buenas soluciones por no pedir ayuda. La ayuda a menudo viene de alguien que nos muestra el camino a seguir, sin resolverlos por nosotros. Quizás si hablamos del problema con otra persona, la solución se nos haga evidente. Si crees que pedir ayuda es señal de debilidad, quizás estés perdiendo la oportunidad de que Dios actúe a través de uno de tus amigos y te brinde apoyo. Y, por supuesto, puedes pedirle ayuda a Dios en oración, dándole la oportunidad de hablar a tu corazón con la respuesta o el ánimo que necesitas.

Los milagros no les ocurren solamente a otras personas. Podemos tener amigos que nos ayudan en momentos de necesidad o nos inspiran con su fe, pero nosotros mismos debemos decidir dar un salto de fe. La tercera cosa que Natán y el leproso hicieron en común fue expresar su fe. Puedes pasarte la vida pensando que eres cristiano, pero si nunca expresas esa fe, no será más que una teoría. Los científicos trabajan con teorías todo el tiempo, pero hasta que no escriben los cálculos o hacen los experimentos, la teoría nunca está probada. San Pablo, en la segunda lectura, por ejemplo, sufría en la prisión, pero no le importó porque su sufrimiento demostraba la importancia del mensaje de Jesús. Así que escribió desde la prisión con la esperanza de que otros cristianos se sintieran alentados en su fe. Quizás conozcas a alguien que te inspiró con su fidelidad y dedicación. Tener un amigo que nos ayude a crecer en la fe puede ser un gran milagro.





We are a newer team at St Luke's that was formed in response to Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si (https://www.vatican.va/ content/francesco/en/encyclicals/documents/papafrancesco 20150524 enciclica-laudato-si.html). Each parish around the world has been tasked with a commitment to care for God's creation. Laudato Si, means praise be to You. Giving praise to God for this amazing world and all it contains. St Francis of Assisi used these same words in his Canticle of Creation written 800 years ago (https://sosf.org/the-canticle-of-creation-a-thankyou-note-to-god-from-st-francis/) which inspired Pope Francis' writing. 


