#### PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

The readings of today enlighten us about the essence of community and the precious gift of peace that Jesus offers us. In the first Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we read about the early Church navigating a conflict about tradition and inclusion. A conflict over the issue of circumcision before being admitted into Christianity and possible salvation. The Apostles and the Elders, guided by the Holy Spirit, come together, listen to one another, and choose unity over division. This shows us that true community is not the absence of conflict but the presence of Love, Humility, and desire for Unity in Christ. May the lord be gracious to us and bless us in this strive for true community living, as the psalmist prays. This prayer for the flourishing of all peoples and for God to shade His light upon us underscores our shared mission to be bearers of God's light in a world that often feels divided by conflicts.

In the second reading from the book of Revelations, we see a vision of the New Jerusalem, a place of Unity and Divine Presence. The description of God dwelling among His people compels us to reflect on our communities. Are we fostering environments where everyone feels welcomed, belonging and embraced and living a shared hope? Or we are by our words and actions building repulsive fences to let others in. What are the likes of circumcision that we are placing on the way of inclusion in our families and Christian communities today?

The reality of conflicts and divisions in our communities and even in the Church, indicates why our Lord promised the coming of the Holy Spirit in today's Gospel passage, namely, to direct the Apostles and the Church and bestow on them the wisdom to judge and settle certain matters. This accounts for why amid the many doctrinal, spiritual, moral, and structural conflicts the Church has battled with and is still battling with, the Church has always remained focused and had recourse to the Holy Spirit, the Scripture, and the Tradition. These have given her direction over the years. This teaches us, that when we encounter problems in our homes, our communities, and the domestic churches, instead of giving up or going the divisive way of our egos, we should seek God's ways out of it in the Scripture and call upon the Holy Spirit for direction and discernment. This does not only go a long way to help us navigate when the going gets tough but also a demonstration of our love for God as Jesus tells us that if we love Him, then we keep his words and Him and His Father will make a home in us. And If God is our side who else can be against us.

#### Capital Campaign Items to discuss:

#### Update on bids/quotes on the roof and chimney,

We are moving forward with sheathing and replacing of the main roof and steeple of the church with the funds we have raised thus far through the Capital Campaign. We will move forward with the sheathing and re-shingling of the sacristy and sanctuary once we have raised additional

The bid to replace part of the roof is \$34,698.76. We have raised \$41,057.33.

#### <u>Prioritized List of Repairs/Replacement from our earlier meetings:</u>

- At this juncture, we will disperse Capital Campaign funds to replace the church roof followed by repairing the church chimney.
- · At upcoming meetings we will review the other items on the prioritized repairs/replacement list that was generated by Fr. Dominic, Gert and others from our parish in June 2024. We will evaluate what is both important and urgent.
- Deacon Dan updated Parish Council members on the fire escape. He and a local engineer looked at the fire escape to determine if it needs to be replaced or repaired. Their assessment concluded that the fire escape needs to be repaired. The recommendation is to reattach the fire escape to the building with lag screws/bolts. At this time, the fire escape is not effectively connected to the parish hall building. The Finance Council will explore quotes to repair the fire escape.
- We have until 2027 to raise funds allocated to the Capital Campaign. There was a question about when the funds from the Capital Campaign needed to be spent. Fr. Justin offered to research the timeline/deadline to disperse the funds.

Other Items Discussed:

#### • <u>Upcoming Summer Mass Schedule Time:</u>

Father Justin updated the parish council on the switch in the Mass times. He is working toward a more consistent schedule for the three worship sites in the future. He is exploring permanent options to Mass times. He will update us when he has worked out the details.

#### • Church Organ

Deacon Dan updated the Parish Council on the condition of the church organ. The organ is over thirty years old, hasn't been used in the church for many years, and is in disrepair. The piano still works and can be utilized for Mass and other events held in the church. Deacon Dan has talked with the Worship and Spirituality Committee about removing the organ from the church. W&S recommended taking this discussion to the Parish Council. Lisa added to the conversation that she had reached out to the music shop in Houlton some time ago to inquire about someone to repair the organ. The person that is experienced in repairing organs of that age has passed away. The Parish Council agreed to let parish members know the condition of the organ, and it has been decided to have it removed from the church. We will let parishioners know via the bulletin that if they would like the organ, they may have it. It will be removed from the church the week of May 25.

Action Items before our Next Meeting:

- Finance Council will explore quotes to repair fire escape
- Someone from Finance Council will update parishioners with an announcement in the bulletin regarding next steps with the Capital Campaign/Roof Repair
- Fr. Justin will research the timeline on spending the money we raised through the Capital Campaign (We have until 2027 to raise funds. What is the timeline/deadline to disperse the funds?)

• The next Parish Council Meeting is scheduled for Monday, June 2 from 6-7:30pm.


