PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear brothers and sisters. The readings for the 3rd Sunday of Easter year C, invite us to reflect on the theme of Resurrection and the call to witness. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we witness the Apostles boldly proclaiming the message of Christ even in the face of the persecution. Their courage teaches us that to bear witness often requires us to confront challenges head-on. In difficult situations, we must bear in mind that our faith has a communal dimension for it inspires and uplift others. The Psalmist tells us that there is also that joy that comes from God's deliverance and being saved in difficult moments. We celebrate this ever-saving presence of God in our lives at Easter time and are reminded of how He transforms our sorrows into joy by the power of His resurrection.

The second reading from the book of Revelations presents a powerful imagery of rejoicing at the victory of the lamb that was slain. The message here is that no matter the difficulties we face in our lives of witnessing, we should look beyond the challenges and recognize the divine victory over sin and death.

In the Gospel text, we encounter the Risen lord who continues to appear to His disciples to strengthen their faith, lest they entirely abandon his teachings. They who abandoned everything to follow him, now found themselves in the danger of abandoning Him to follow everything. However, while resuming their old occupation of fishing, they faced the challenge of catching nothing. Then our Lord appeared to them and told them to cast their nets into the deep. On obeying his instructions, they had a greater catch of fish. And it took the beloved disciple John to point out, "He is the Lord." This teaches us that with him by us, our worries are calmed down, our desperations are met and our security guaranteed. With the Risen lord with us, fear not. This is a strong message to our three neophytes who were fully initiated into the Catholic Faith during the Easter Vigil and our 2 children completing their sacraments of Christian initiation with the reception of First Holy Communion and Confirmation this weekend from the hands of Bishop (Continued on page 2....) Ruggieri.

With these Sacraments of Christ and His Power with them, they, as well as all of us now called an Easter people, are called upon to proclaim and demonstrate our love for Christ by being courageous witnesses to the Gospel values wherever we find ourselves. Let us transform our denials of yesterday to present declarations of love expressed in humble service and courageous witnessing to him as Peter did. Jesus is asking you today: "Do you really love Me"? Then consider joining the priesthood or religious life to continue with the work of feeding His lamb and his sheep as he told Peter to do. "Do you love Me?", Then serve him in any ministry in His church. "Do you really love Me?", Then be his witnesses in word and indeed. Congratulations to the Confirmands of our cluster, their catechists. families and godparents or sponsors.



For centuries, the month of May has been dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. In his encyclical Mense Maio, Pope Paul VI wrote, "This is the month during which Christians, in their churches and their homes, offer the Virgin Mother more fervent and loving acts of homage and veneration; and it is the month in which a greater abundance of God's merciful gifts come down to us from our Mother's throne" (April 29, 1964).

During May, it is common for parishes to honor the Blessed Mother with May Crowning ceremonies, traditionally held toward the beginning of the month. Parishioners, most often children, adorn statues of Mary with crowns of flowers, which are also placed around her feet.

Mother-Daughter Retreat - Frenchville


