Weekly Reflection

Dear Cherished members of the Body of Christ.

Today we celebrate the precious and Priceless gift of the Body and Blood of Christ otherwise called Corpus Christi. A gift given to us through the Church by Christ Himself as food for our Spiritual Journey. Belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and not just a symbol is central and crucial to our Catholic Faith. Hence the Church teaches that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life for everything in the Church and in our Christian lives derives its meaning from the Eucharist, centers around the Eucharist and leads to the Eucharist. No Eucharist, no Apostolic succession, no bishops, no priests, no Christians, No Church, and we would not be here today and every other Sunday. By his real presence in the Eucharist, Christ fulfills his promise of being present with us always till the end of time(cf. Mtt28:20). He is the word that became flesh and is dwelling among us to save us. In today’s first reading, Melchizedek, priest of God Most High offers bread and wine as a blessing upon Abraham. Jesus fulfills this offering in the second reading by giving us his Body and Blood under the forms of bread and wine. Thus is our hunger satisfied in abundance as we make our pilgrim way to the heavenly banquet feast, as illustrated in the Gospel

In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine becomes the body and blood of Jesus Christ, through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest as Christ did and commanded the apostles to do same on the last supper. The whole Christ is truly present- body, blood, soul and divinity- under the appearances of bread and Wine- the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. By eating the Body and drinking the blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. He remains in us and us in Him(Cf, Jn 6:56). And in being united with Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity for both are inseparable. In this way, our corruptible bodies are transformed by being joined to the source of life.....

In the Eucharist, Christ is healing and transforming the lives of so many who believe in Him. The devil dreads, trembles and flees in his presence. Jesus has changed the lives and stories of many who adore Him. So many Eucharistic Miracles abound. The challenge is: Do we believe, and do we give the Eucharist the reverence that it deserves? We have the opportunity today to demonstrate our belief in the real and transforming presence of Jesus as we go on procession into the streets with the Eucharist as a sign of our common faith and adoration. Bear in mind today, that the Eucharist is more than a Miraculous change of bread and wine. As a gift that was taken, broken, blessed and shared, it is an invitation for a life of thanksgiving, communion, service and sharing. We must take the gifts we are blessed with nor matter how small they may seem in our judgement, thank God for them, break them and share with others. The lord in his goodness, will bless them for his greater glory. Givers never lack.

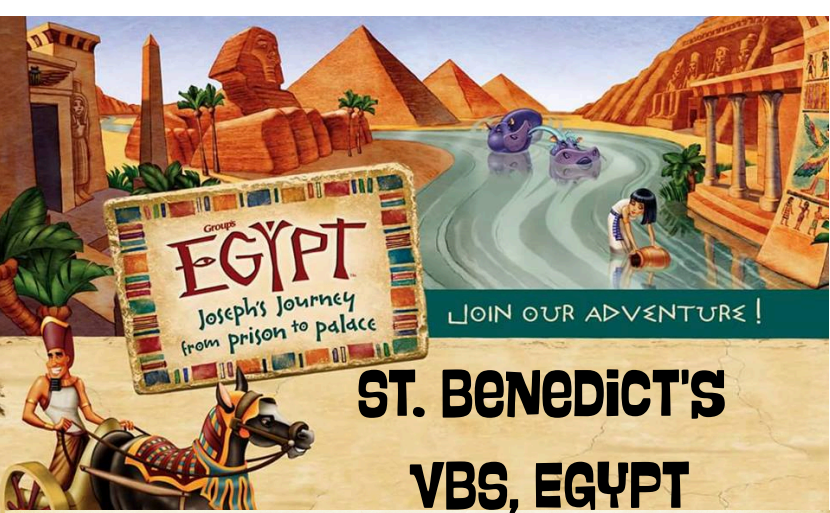

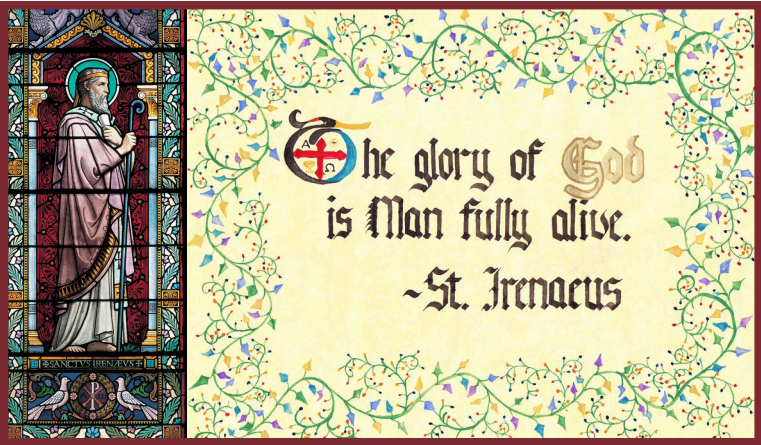
