Pastor's Corner - Feed My Sheep (Table of the Word) Theme: Christian Stewardship

Today's Readings invite us to reflect on the call to vigilant stewardship in our Christian lives. They encourage us to stay faithful, prepare for what is to come and rely on God's promises. In the First Reading from the Book of wisdom, we see a powerful image of Hope. The Israelites held on to their faith during the time of their liberation, believing that God would save them. This believe in their deliverance was rooted in God's promise. This teaches us that faith is not just a passive belief, but it is an active trust in God's goodness and timing especially in our moments of trials. In this connection, today's Psalmist invites us to rejoice and proclaim our trust in the Lord's providence.

In the Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, faith is defined as the "assurance of things hoped for, the the conviction of things not seen." The example of Abraham and the Patriarchs stand before us as models of unwavering trust. They ventured into the unknown, believing that God would fulfill His promises, even when the fulfillment lay far beyond their earthly lives.

In the Gospel text of today from St. Luke, Jesus emphasizes that our faith should translate into readiness. He speaks of servants waiting for their master not idling away nor passively but being vigilant and responsible with what has been entrusted to us. As stewards, we are called not only to nurture our own faith but also to share God's love and resources with others. The master who returns finds those servants ready and faithful and he will reward them. This reminds us of our call to live as examples of God's love and grace in a world marked by uncertainty and fear. Every act of kindness, every moment of service, every opportunity to grow in faith matters. As Christians we do not have the time to loiter about doing nothing. We have a mission and a goal. A mission within a limited time to let God's Kingdom reign on earth through our good deeds and a goal to reach heaven at the end. So, let's set to work before it is too late.







Mary, Queen assumed into heaven, I rejoice that after years of heroic martyrdom on earth, you have at last been taken to the throne prepared for you in heaven by the Holy Trinity.

Lift my heart with you in the glory of your Assumption above the dreadful touch of sin and impurity. Teach me how small earth becomes when viewed from heaven. Make me realize that death is the triumphant gate through which I shall pass to your Son, and that someday my body shall rejoin my soul in the unending bliss of heaven.

From this earth, over which I tread as a pilgrim, I look to you for help. I ask for this favor: (Mention your request).

When my hour of death has come, lead me safely to the presence of Jesus to enjoy the vision of my God for all eternity together with you.

The Assumption is the feast that celebrates Mary's being taken body and soul into Heaven at the end of her earthly life. Among the various celebrations in the Catholic Church, one that can be confusing to some is the Assumption of Mary, celebrated on August 15.

What does the Assumption of Mary mean?

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the Assumption refers to an event

that occurred at the end of the Virgin Mary's life.

"Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death."

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians. (CCC 966)

This is a belief in the Catholic Church that has its origin in the first few centuries of Christianity, finding its source in early stories of the Virgin Mary's "death."

St. John Damascene, an 8th century Christian author, wrote about how fitting it was for the Virgin Mary to be assumed into Heaven.

It was fitting that she, who had kept her virginity intact in childbirth, should keep her own body free from all corruption even after death. It was fitting that she, who had carried the Creator as a child at her breast, should dwell in the divine tabernacles. It was fitting that the spouse, whom the Father had taken to himself, should live in the divine mansions. It was fitting that she, who had seen her Son upon the cross and who had thereby received into her heart the sword of sorrow which she had escaped in the act of giving birth to him, should look upon him as he sits with the Father. It was fitting that God's Mother should possess what belongs to her Son, and that she should be honored by every creature as the Mother and as the handmaid of God.

Pius XII details in his apostolic constitution, Munificentissimus Deus how this belief has been handed down over the ages and finds evidence even in scripture.

Moreover, the scholastic Doctors have recognized the Assumption of the Virgin Mother of God as something signified, not only in various figures of the Old Testament, but also in that woman clothed with the sun whom John the Apostle contemplated on the Island of Patmos. Similarly they have given special attention to these words of the New Testament: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you, blessed are you among women," since they saw, in the mystery of the Assumption, the fulfillment of that most perfect grace granted to the Blessed Virgin and the special blessing that countered the curse of Eve.

The Assumption is an ancient celebration, one that honors the Virgin Mary and her role in salvation history and the eternal destination prepared for her by her Son, Jesus.
