Pastor's Corner - Feed My Sheep (Table of the Word) Theme: A Call To Persevere In Hardships Of Our Christian Calling Dear and Beloved People of God

The readings for the 20th Sunday of Ordinary time Year C, invite us to reflect on Perseverance in hardships. In the first reading, the Lord came to the aid of the Prophet Jeremiah whose preaching brought upon him rejection and ill-treatment. For those who live by faith and stick to the Gospel values, misunderstanding and division must likewise be expected as Jesus states in today's Gospel text from St. Luke. We are told in today's Second reading from the letter to the Hebrews, that like Christ, we should never be despondent or abandon the struggle to proclaim and live by the truths of our faith. Some people give up so soon and even at a time when their efforts are just about yielding fruits of blessings for them, their loved ones and community.

Jeremiah embodies the call to be faithful even if it leads to suffering. His unwavering commitment to truth reminds us that prophetic voices often attract opposition. Trust in the Lord's deliverance at such moment is the reason for our hanging on and not giving up. We are therefore like Jeremiah, invited to cultivate trust and perseverance in our own lives of struggles Our trials no matter how overwhelming, become opportunities for growth and deeper faith.

Jesus reminds us in the Gospel that He has come not to bring peace but division. This statement is metaphoric. Jesus stood radically for the truth, and as we know, whoever speaks the truth is not always accepted. This will cause division in the camp of those who hate and hide the truth and those who are unwilling to face the truth or be told the truth. The love and flame of His message can separate people. Jesus did not compromise the truth by telling people only what they would like to hear. So Jesus is saying that following him is not always a path of comfort and peace. It can lead us into conflict, even among those we love and live with. Being a Christian is not democratic where a majority carries the vote. It is an invitation to follow in the footsteps of Christ, our master and model in living our Christian calling to the full and core, even if it means separation from or confrontation with our closest family, friends, or neighbors. Jesus calls us to confront the divisions our faith might bring rather than giving up. This is quite challenging but a vital aspect of discipleship. I pray that we may have that peace that comes from doing His will and in turn share with those around us.



The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary



The Catholic Church celebrates each year the feast of the Queenship of Mary on August 22. Previously this feast was celebrated on May 31, established by Pope Pius XII.

Pius XII also instituted the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 1944, originally assigning it to August 22.

However, after the revision of the General Calendar, Pope Paul VI decided to switch the feasts of the Immaculate Heart and the Queenship of Mary. The feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was joined to the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (celebrated on the Saturday following the feast of the Sacred Heart, typically in June) and the Queenship of Mary was moved to August 22. What's interesting is how this switching of feast days is actually quite appropriate and in line with Pius XII's own writings and actions

Consecration to the Immaculate Heart

Pius XII wrote in his encyclical Ad Caeli Reginam (On the Queenship of Mary) that he desired to renew the consecration of the world to Mary's Immaculate Heart, on the feast of the Queenship of Mary!

Since we are convinced, after long and serious reflection, that great good will accrue to the Church if this solidly established truth shines forth more clearly to all, like a luminous lamp raised aloft, by Our Apostolic authority We decree and establish the feast of Mary's Queenship, which is to be celebrated every year in the whole world on the 31st of May. We likewise ordain that on the same day the consecration of the human race to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary be renewed, cherishing the hope that through such consecration a new era may begin, joyous in Christian peace and in the triumph of religion.

He saw a close connection between Mary's queenship and her heart, the heart of a mother.

"With a heart that is truly a mother's," to quote again Our Predecessor of immortal memory, Pius IX, "does she approach the problem of our salvation, and is solicitous for the whole human race; made Queen of heaven and earth by the Lord, exalted above all choirs of angels and saints, and standing at the right hand of her only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, she intercedes powerfully for us with a mother's prayers, obtains what she seeks, and cannot be refused."

Above all, Pius XII believed that we should all go to Mary, the Queen of our Hearts, and beg for her assistance. Let all, therefore, try to approach with greater trust the throne of grace and mercy of our Queen and Mother, and beg for strength in adversity, light in darkness, consolation in sorrow; above all let them strive to free themselves from the slavery of sin and offer an unceasing homage, filled with filial loyalty, to their Queenly Mother.

Even though the feasts were switched by a different pope, it providentially reflects a deeper spiritual truth and how the two concepts are intimately connected.

Praver:

Mother and Queen of Heaven, this day I run to you as a child with confidence and trust. You are the glorious Queen Mother, reigning over all of your children with love and mercy. Please pray for me, and bestow upon me all that I need. I open my heart to the grace of your Son, which you are entrusted to dispense. Make me holy and free from sin, so you can present me spotless and pure to your beloved Son, the King of the Universe. Queen of Heaven, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.
