REFELCTING WITH THE PASTOR

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER • MAY 8, 2016

What does it mean?

This being Mother's Day weekend, all of us are thinking of our mothers and the impact they have had on making us the men and women we are. It has been eight years since my mother died but not a day goes by that I don't think of her, talk to her and wish she were here. May God bless every mother and give them the strength to be witnesses of love, mercy and generosity to their children.

My Mom and Dad are no longer with me like I would like. But I know, in faith, that I will see them again if I, like them, believe and follow the Lord the best I can. The disciples on this Feast of the Ascension, are seen looking up to the sky as Jesus leaves them to go to His Father. They are astonished and frightened thinking that Jesus will no longer be with them the way they want. For the past few weeks we have been hearing Jesus reassure them, "Do not be afraid. I am and will be with you always." The Easter stories showed Jesus trying to assure his followers that they were really experiencing him and not some illusion. He walked, talked, and ate with them. They came to realize that the one who had died on the cross was now alive. Just as I believe my parents are alive with the Lord. I, we, believe Jesus is alive and with us.

The church is now living a new reality. It is no longer acceptable to stare at the sky and dream of the "good old days", "the way we want things to be" or "the way we want things to be". Like those first disciples, our attention is being redirected from one experience of Jesus to a new one... seeing Jesus in everyone we meet. We cannot stand looking up to heaven. We have work to do. If Jesus' message is to be brought into the world, it is now up to us to do it. Just as mothers pass on life and send their children out into the world to use and share their gifts...Jesus blesses us, assures us and sends us to bring his message of life and love, his message of God's Kingdom to everyone we meet.

WORSHIPPING WELL! - THE GATHERING RITE PART II

If liturgy is something done by everyone together, then it's clear what we have to do. We have to make the church look like the church, act like the church, sound like the church. We have to congregate to make a congregation. We have to assemble to make an assembly. There are lots of times in life to come in here and pray alone. There are lots of times in life to pray alone wherever you are. But Sunday Mass is not one of those times. Sunday Mass is what we do together. That isn't a theory that will work no matter how we look in here, how we sound, how we act. It isn't a theory; it's practice. The church has to get itself together. If we work at it, all of us, maybe we'll come to a time when we'll walk through the door and, without even thinking about it, head for the empty place closest to the altar. If we work at it, we won't have to imagine that we are one in Christ; we'll act like we are. The room will fill from these seats to those seats to those and only as far out as there are people here. The reason, let's be clear on this, is not that there is some special holiness in getting close to the altar; the reason is that there is the holiness of the church in getting close to one another and doing this deed together. So, maybe we can begin. Come forward when we arrive. And if a row is empty, don't sit on the end protecting it — let us take a place in the middle of that row as if inviting others to sit beside us.

There should be graciousness in our gathering. Kindness and hospitality are not the enemies of peaceful assembling. Smiling, nodding in welcome even to those I do not know by name, greeting others warmly: These are building up the body of Christ. Ushers and sometimes other persons have the task of helping us in these first moments together: a greeting, help with getting to a seat, other hospitable deeds. But ushers only specialize in what we must all do for one another: make it clear that all alike are welcome here. That is why we have to do the best we can to make this place welcoming to all of us, those of us with disabilities, those with young children, those who are elderly. 

The Lemon Tree: An Arab, A Jew & the Heart of the Middle East

In 1967, a Palestinian 25 yr. old, journeyed to Israel, with the goal of seeing his former house, with the lemon tree behind it, that he and his family had fled nineteen years earlier. To his surprise, when he found the house he was greeted by a 19 yr. old Israeli college student, whose family fled Europe for Israel following the Holocaust. On the stoop of their shared home, they began a rare friendship, forged in the aftermath of war and tested over the next thirty-five years in ways that neither could imagine on that summer day in 1967. Based on extensive research, and springing from his enormously resonant documentary that aired on NPR's Fresh Air in 1998, Sandy Tolan brings the Israeli-Palestinian conflict down to its most human level, suggesting that even amid the bleakest political realities there exist stories of hope and reconciliation.



- Lend a listening ear to those going through a tough time
- Make a home cooked meal for a friend who is facing a difficult time
- Write a letter or send a card to someone who is suffering
- A few moments of your day may make a lifetime of difference to someone who is going through a difficult time

Ascension of the Lord



Acts 1:1-11 + Eph 1:17-23 + Lk 24:46-53

In Luke's ascension account from Acts, Jesus admonishes his apostles to stay in Jerusalem and wait for the Spirit because they are witnesses of his mission and message. When the time for his ascension comes, Jesus blesses them, then "was lifted up" (1:9). We don't hear the great commission to go out to, preach to, and baptize all nations as we do in Matthew's Gospel (28:19–20). Instead, Luke's account leaves us with an image of the apostles joyfully returning to Jerusalem: "They were continually in the temple praising God" (24:53).

Returning to Acts, I love that the early disciples' first order of business—even prior to Pentecost—was to gather to pray (1:14). Paul often admonished the early Christians to pray constantly. He knew that prayer grounds us in the Lord and strengthens us to lay down our lives and carry our crosses. Prayer focuses our attention on God's call and our response to it. The apostles' prayer opened them to receive the promised gift of the Spirit and strengthened them for their mission—to let the world know that Jesus is Lord, that the Kingdom of God has come, and that we have been restored through the death and resurrection of Christ.

Thus should our week begin: in praise and worship before God, in gathered prayer. Like the disciples in Jerusalem, the Lord will open our minds "to understand the scriptures" (Luke



24:45). We, too, will be filled with the Spirit and be sent out as joyful witnesses to God's presence and saving work.
