DO YOU WANT TO GROW UP?



When I was younger I always thought it would be great to be a "grown up." You wouldn't have anyone telling you what to do. You can make your own decisions. You would only be responsible for yourself. Now that I am "grown up"... I wish I were still a child. It is so much easier to be obedient to others... to let someone else make the tough decisions. Being a "grown up"... means doing the loving thing not just for yourself but for all those around you. It means thinking, what is best for others, not just myself. There are so many options, so many possibilities, in some ways it is easier not to grow up. Let someone else earn the "big

bucks" choosing the best thing from so many possibilities. Decisions, decisions, decisions! If only someone would just tell us what to choose... what to do!

All of our readings for this Sunday focus on some aspect of the wisdom of our religious ancestors, a wisdom that has been handed down to us through the teachings of our faith. The Book of Wisdom states that many of our choices do not flow from noble, loving, caring aspirations. We are selfish or cruel; we are arrogant or dishonest; we are ignorant and inexperienced. If we are honest, we come to realize we can't do it on our own...we need divine guidance. But even in seeking this guidance, we can easily be deceived by our own ego.

Paul is inviting Philemon to make a difficult decision. He is being asked to treat his slave as his equal... set aside your rights and establish true equality with Onesimus, who like yourself is a believer and follower of Jesus. He is given by Paul, but the decision is Philemon's. We, too, are asked to set aside our rights, our desire to make others "our slaves.... under our control" and treat everyone as our equal...part of the same team....



in loving relationship with each other because of our relationship with Jesus. Can we, like Philemon, see beyond ourselves and our own needs and wants to the depth of the other? Can we see one another not as an object to be used but as a true brother and sister in Jesus? Do we have what it takes to live as disciples of Jesus?

Our way of life as disciples and believers appears to be foolishness if judged by the standards of the world. However, if we have the wisdom and insight that comes from God we move beyond the shallow values of our time to the joy and freedom of God's kingdom.



CATHOLICS CARE. CATHOLICS VOTE.

Catholic voters should use the framework of Catholic social teaching to examine candidates' positions on issues affecting human life and dignity as well as issues of justice and peace, and they should consider candidates' integrity, philosophy, and performance. It is important for all citizens "to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign rhetoric critically, and to choose



their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest" (Living the Gospel of Life, no. 33).

What Does the Church Say About Catholic Social Teaching in the Public Square? Principle of The Dignity of the Human Person: The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, human life is under direct attack from abortion and euthanasia. The value of human life is being threatened by cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching also calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding increasingly effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.


September 4, 2016 + Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) Wis 9:13–18b + Phlm 9–10, 12–17 + Lk 14:25–33

In my family, three members like to plan for what's ahead: What are we going to do? How will it get done? How are we going to get there? What will happen when we do? I can tolerate certain changes up until the day we leave, but after that, change is difficult for me. My daughter hates change at any point and does not rest until a revised plan is made. My husband lies somewhere in between. Our other daughter is a much more freewheeling spirit. "I never make plans that far in advance," she would say when I asked her what she was doing that evening. We would often just stare at each other in wonder. After thirty years, we have also rubbed off on each other in some ways.

Becoming a disciple of Christ takes both planning and flexibility. The planning comes in preparing ourselves

to let go of anything that gets in the way of our service to the Lord. For most of us, that will not be our parents, but it might be something or someone in our society or culture. Jesus' challenge comes in the realization that nothing can come between Christ and us—not even our parents—and if they did, we would need to turn from them in order to follow him. The flexibility comes in the understanding that we do not know what or who we might have to give up, or the moment and manner in which Christ will ask us to pick up our cross and follow in his footsteps. All we can do is pray for the grace and courage to do what he asks when he asks it.
