APRIL 2, 2017 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

UNTIE HIM AND SET HIM FREE...

The last time I was in Washington D.C. I went on a tour bus at night to see the various monuments. We made the circuit of the Washington monument, Jefferson memorial, Iwo Jima monument, Korea, World War II and the Vietnam Memorial. Since my father fought in World War II, Korea and Vietnam, those were the most moving for me. I tried to imagine what men and women in those dark times must have been feeling and thinking. On the cool and rainy night of the tour, I was especially struck by the reactions of people at the Vietnam memorial.



That long black granite wall with thousands of names of those who lost their lives in that war, brought out something strange in the lives of the hundreds of people standing there that night... and probably every day and night. There was a hush of reverence over the whole setting. Some were obviously just there like myself as spectators... passing over the names quickly... moved, but not personally affected by any one of them. But there were others there who paused at a particular name. They slowly

rubbed the name if they could reach it. Some wept, others were lost in grief. I couldn't help but wonder what the relationship was between the living person and the name: husband, son, father, brother, friend. The depth of their relationship... the memories... the intimacy... investment of life one person made in another person... made a difference in how they reacted to the Wall, and how I reacted to it. I was moved by the horror and sacrifice screaming from the silence of the Wall... they were moved by a personal relationship that was ended.

Today Jesus is moved to tears for his friend Lazarus. He reminds Martha and Mary that He is the resurrection and the life. He said, "I know mine and mine know me...." Faith says that death is not the end. God can move the huge stone at Jesus' grave... Jesus can call Lazarus forth and tell the crowd to untie him. God can and will, do the same for us. Such is the force of God's love. Today, we are invited to enter a personal relationship with Jesus that we too might be called to a new life. That is the beauty and power of the Holy Spirit that I have witnessed as so many of you have gone through ChristLife. My hope and prayer is that all of you will take advantage of this deeply moving experience or some other opportunity here at St. Susanna.



The pain of death and loss pass, but the beauty and love of God remains. After the ravages of sickness and death, the beauty of love and eternity remains. I know the older I get, the more seriously I take the promise of Jesus, "I am with you always... if you believe you will never die... I no longer call you slaves but friends." Perhaps you do as well. Perhaps that is why the Church offers us this beautiful reading about Lazarus immediately before we walk the road of Calvary with Jesus and stand beneath his cross. When all seems lost, when the body begins to break down, when the world isn't the way I want it to be... Jesus is there, calling us out of the darkness. God can be trusted to do more for us than we can ever imagine. Jesus, the light of the world, the light at the end of our journeys... is there waiting for us. Be a people of hope. Be a people of the promise... believe, live what you believe and be set free! It happened to Lazarus and it will happen to us.

IS THE RCIA FOR ME?

The RCIA is for three groups of people:

- 1. Those who are not baptized.
- Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- Baptized Catholics who were never formed in the Catholic faith and have not completed their initiation; that is, who have received neither of the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

A fourth group of people, practicing Catholics who have never received sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, should contact Susan Hack, ext. 3169 or hacks@stsusanna.org.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) classes are year-round. There is no commitment to continue. A person could take all the classes and still make a decision to not come into the Church. Of course, we hope you will! There are certain rites that mark the time when a person feels ready to go on with the process. They begin with Rite of Acceptance in which the person declares their intention to the Church and the Church in turn accepts them. God showers his grace on the candidates, since the celebration manifests their desire publicly and marks their reception and first consecration by the Church. The second step is the Rite of Election or Enrollment of Names. This happens with the start of Lent and is the formal rite when a person makes the decision to go forward completely with the process.



Walk with the Lord each Friday of Lent at 7:00pm in Church. We will pray the Stations of the Cross, walking with Jesus to Calvary and opening our hearts to His love and mercy.



DIRECT TRADE COFFEE FOR CUSTOMERS WHO CARE

A direct trade coffee company rooted in

social justice and Catholic Social Teachings, Better World Beans works directly with 15 farmers from a cooperative in the rural mountains of the Dominican Republic. Founder/CEO, Andrew Hermann, also a Senior at Xavier University in Cincinnati, OH, will be available after all Masses on Saturday, April 8 and Sunday, April 9. He will share his story and have coffee samples and bags for purchase after Mass.

The business' Three Main Pillars: Stewardship, Quality, and Relationship embody the ethics and philosophy that Better World Beans uses with the farmers and its loyal customer base in the United States. Andrew was originally introduced to this community while on a high school immersion trip and has returned every year since. After a serious economic crisis that left the small-producing family farmers of the community with virtually no income for the year, the farmers, Andrew and the community worked together to plan and build the business model behind Better World Beans. They pay more than four times what the farmers previously made, which is also more than twice as much as Organic certification and Fair Trade Labels pay their coffee farmers. The increased earnings are life changing for the farmers and their families who struggle with basic needs.

Andrew will be graduating with a degree in Organic Agriculture, which he will use in his work with the coffee farmers in the Dominican Republic. Better World Beans teaches that coffee production can be done in a way that protects the land, increases the quality of coffee, and grows a variety of additional food products for consumption to further increase the quality of life. Come listen to Andrew's personal story, try some coffee, and learn why ethical coffee matters.

St. Susanna Used Computer Drive to Take Place Before ALL Masses the Weekend of April 22nd and 23rd

St. Susanna is teaming up with Good Shepherd's Computer Recycling Ministry. The Ministry's goal is to reclaim old PCs keeping them from going to landfills and to provide for those less fortunate individuals who would not otherwise have access to computers. Good Shepherd's Ministry has delivered over 350 PCs to various groups, providing them the resources for training and learning purposes and to parishioners who need to complete educational and training programs. To protect the donors, a program is used to over-write the entire disk and wipe the hard drive clean of all previous files and information. Each PC is then loaded with a free Windows-like system and a free MS Office work-a-like which reduces costs for the Ministry while providing the recipients with a familiar computer system and eases the learning curve.

ST. SUSANNA FOOTBALL: A PARENT AND PEDIATRICIAN'S PERSPECTIVE (WEEK 2) By Nicole S. M. George, MD

This series, by a St. Susanna parishioner, discusses how St. Susanna Football addresses the recommendations by the American Academy of Pediatrics regarding youth football.

2. Officials and coaches must enforce the rules

of proper tackling, including zero tolerance for illegal, head-first hits. Some of the studies showed that delaying tackling until older ages just created more injuries at the older ages. The AAP feels that proper "heads-up" tackling technique needs to be taught at the earliest age football is played. There has been a cultural shift across all of youth football heeding these recommendations. All St. Susanna coaches must participate in the Heads Up program of USA Football. At the slightest hint of head injury, the players are evaluated on the sideline and may not return to play. Many of the coaches also attend clinics and workshops reinforcing proper and safe playing techniques and drills. Per the (Greater Catholic Youth) League, the players must have a 3 practice acclimation prior to wearing full equipment, and there will be no contact during the acclimation. St. Susanna's program practices "full go" (tackle to the ground) tackling no

Our Resurrection

The raising of Lazarus is a decisive miracle in Christ's public ministry. It leads to increased hostility and gives the Jewish leaders both an excuse and a motivation to actively seek the death of Jesus. This Gospel episode is so important that John dedicates an entire chapter to the story.

What is the most important message of this miracle? Without faith in Jesus, there is no resurrection. A fitting message for an artist painting in Europe right after World War II.


Looking at the painting of Annigoni, Mary is at the feet of Jesus while Martha is on her feet pouring out her heart. The artist evokes a landscape of death and destruction, one too often observed in postwar Europe. Colors of decay abound. Stones are piled up like rubble. The trees are burnt, scrawny, and twisted as if after an air raid. It is ugly, rugged, barren, and dry. A small group of people have gathered to weep at the tomb.

Jesus is the only source of color and life. After Martha affirms her faith in Jesus and the resurrection, he lifts up his hand and calls out. The onlookers peer inside, perhaps having heard the sounds of rustling coming from the cave.

The message of this artwork is clear to anyone struggling with the bondage of a destructive past. Jesus wants to speak words of life and raise us from the grips of death, war, and despair.

Believe in Jesus and he will raise you up!
