TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The debt labeled as a 'huge amount' in today's Gospel has a more specific amount in the original languages. It is ten thousand talents - which is the equivalent of sixty million daily wages! The servant would need about 164,000 YEARS to repay the debt! This clearly demonstrates the infinite and incredible mercy of the master - God the Father. Thankfully, through the perfect sacrifice of Jesus Christ, the forgiveness of sins is possible! We are called to confess our sins, express sorrow, and amend our lives through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What an incredible gift! No matter the offense, God will forgive us. In turn, God asks us to seek this forgiveness of our sins, but also to forgive the sins of those who offend us.

St. Maria Goretti preached this gospel through her short life and martyrdom. She was known for her unrelenting and contagious joy and generosity. At the young, tender age of 12, her neighbor Alessandro tried to steal her purity. Maria pleaded with him to stop crying out, "No! It is a sin! God does not want it!" Instead, Alessandro stabbed her in the abdomen 14 times. Maria's dying words in the hospital bed were, "Yes, I forgive him and want him to be in Paradise with me some day." Alessandro, while serving a 30 year sentence, saw Maria in a dream and heard these same words of forgiveness. Upon awaking, he had a drastic conversion to the faith. In fact, in a beautiful witness to forgiveness and mercy, Maria's mother and Alessandro attended Maria's canonization Mass together in 1950. Let us ask St. Maria for her intercession that we may better understand the weight of our own sins, grow in the grace to forgive others, and give thanks for the immense mercy of our Triune God!



On another note, I wanted to take a second to give you all an update of my seminary studies. I am just beginning my third year of Theology at The Athenaeum and Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West. Last year, I was on pastoral internship up at Holy Angels Parish in Sidney, OH. It is great to be back with a FULL house of seminarians to play soccer and ultimate frisbee with! After 7 years of formation, it is difficult to believe, that pending approval and God willing, my classmates and I will be ordained to the transitional diaconate in April of 2018 and the priesthood in May of 2019! Please keep those prayers coming for my classmates and me as we are in the final stretch. Also, please don't forget to pray for the other son of the parish, Jeff Stephens in Pre-Theology II. THANK YOU immensely for all of your prayers and please know that I pray for St. Susanna Parish every day. I am blessed to call St. Susanna my home.

Let us pray that we may grow in holiness and obtain the grace of mercy in our lives!




You can dedicate the placing of flowers at the altar in memory of a loved one or to honor a special occasion. The amount is \$50 to defray the cost of the flowers.

The Church, therefore, exhorts her sons, that through dialogue and collaboration with the followers of other religions, carried out with prudence and love and in witness to the Christian faith and life, they recognize, preserve and promote the good things, spiritual and moral, as well as the socio-cultural values found among men. (Second Vatican Council, Nostra Aetate, no.2)

Right Judgment

Often when we think of a judge, we think of severity or cold justice. Courtroom and criminal-justice dramas—even some news coverage of major crimes and scandals—love depicting the offender as receiving his or her just rewards, with the judge or prosecutor smugly reflecting or sighing in relief.

But in the scriptural sense, a judge is much more. A good judge is an educator, teacher, and parent. Good judges promote wise living and respect for authority and the law. Their tools are sometimes mercy, sometimes penance, but always prompted by love.

A better image to understand the judge’s role is a parent educating his or her child. Sometimes education means letting something slide; sometimes it means holding the child accountable. Both can be expressions of love.

Today’s readings caution us against selfish passions that prompt us to judge. One who has been forgiven much but is then harsh with others will be severely punished—or as Sirach puts it, God “remembers their sins in detail.”

Mercy toward others is key to the Gospel message. Some think they are good Christians because they don’t steal and haven’t killed anyone. They may even be active in their parish but are highly critical of others.

Remember, as Jesus said: “The measure with which you measure will be measured out to you” (Matthew

7:2). And, “So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives his brother from his heart.”
