
COME TO THE FEAST...

Years ago, I remember seeing my niece and nephews receive "participation" trophies at the end of every sports season. Trophies for baseball, medals for basketball, math and science competitions... you name it. As they grew older it seemed the "participation" accolades lessened and trophies were given for real achievements. My nephew John said he was happier feeling the award he received for golf actually meant something. He said, "This means something to me. I don't think I deserve a trophy for just showing up."



In some way, that's what is happening in Matthew's gospel this week. Jesus tells the story about the king who threw a wedding banquet for his son. In some way, it mirrors what we heard last week... the people of Israel, who ignored the prophets and were banished from the vineyard, set alongside those who accepted the invitation to work and produced good fruit.

The Good News is there is a royal marriage. The Bad News is that too many of us refuse the invitation because we are too busy or don't think the event is important enough or it doesn't interest us. In the end, everyone is invited to the feast... both good and bad.



The strange twist, and unfair twist, is that one last-minute person invited is thrown out because he is not wearing the wedding robe. In Matthew's time, the robe was the symbol of conversion. The person becoming a Christian through Baptism received a new identity, put away the old life and embraced the new. This was symbolized by putting on a white robe. In essence, the guest in the gospel accepted the invitation to the feast but has done nothing else in response. He doesn't change his life, behavior etc... the invitation actually didn't mean that much to him. It was just a good party to attend. It is not enough just to simply show up. One has to recognize the value of the banquet and do something in response to God's invitation.

Heaven is offered to everyone... the "participation trophy." But we still have to do our part in response to the gift. We need to accept it... appreciate it... and respond by living a life that bears good fruit.... "the real trophy." To whom much is given... much is required or expected. Don't just show up and pose for the picture while holding our trophy. The gift of salvation has to mean something.

We're the Supporting Cast

Life can make us think we are in control of our lives. We plan, think, execute, and succeed (or fail). Then along comes an illness, an accident, a job loss, or one of countless other things, and we realize we really aren't in control of much. This famous phrase sums it up: Man proposes, God disposes.

We can transfer this same false assumption into

our relationship with God and expect Mass, prayer, and liturgy to work for us, fill us, and entertain us. But liturgy and prayer are about giving God his glory above all else.

When we pray, and especially when we enter into communal liturgy, we are reminded once again that it is all about what God is doing. Isaiah says the Lord will provide for all people. God will provide! We might prepare, serve, or participate, but the director, producer, and main actor is God. We are the supporting cast. That is why liturgy is not so much about our planning, participation, or entertainment but about entering into harmony with God's action and praising him as he asks.

The same point can be found in the Gospel. The king sends out invitations for his son's wedding and prepares the feast. He adjusts to the unexpected lack of interest and invites others. The ones who arrive are the ones the master has invited.

It would be foolish for one of the invited guests to vaunt their importance. Their role is to humbly enjoy and gracefully help the king and the newlyweds to shine on their night!
