THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

PLUNGED INTO RIGHTEOUSNESS

Every winter, my good friend Fr. Ethan Moore does something that I think is crazy: a polar bear plunge. On New Year's Day, people in different places strip down and jump into icy lakes. Fr. Ethan enters into this tradition in Fort Loramie, Ohio. After celebrating a Mass of Consecration, he takes a plunge for our Blessed Mother. Though I think it's crazy, this plunge is also deeply meaningful. How much more is this true of the Baptism of the Lord!



Celebrating the Baptism of Jesus marks the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of Ordinary Time in our liturgical year. In Luke's gospel, it also marks the end of the "hidden life" of Jesus at Nazareth. Exiting the manger, we pass with the Jesus through the waters of the Jordan, where He is even more clearly revealed as the Christ, anointed with the Holy Spirit. Emerging from these waters, purified with the power of God, we must eventually follow Our Lord into the desert - that spiritual wilderness wherein we wrestle against temptation and death.

Yet for now, let us rest along the banks of the Jordan and meditate on this Baptism. What just happened here? What does it mean? What difference does it make for me?

The second reading from the Letter of St. Paul to Titus tells us the answer: "When the kindness and generous love of God our Savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of His mercy, He saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by His grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life."

Descending into the Jordan, Jesus Christ - Son of God and Son of Mary - instituted the Sacrament which makes possible our renewed relationship with God the Father. The biblical word for this relationship is righteousness. With this righteousness - right relationship of the believer with God - flourishes justice. Not justice in the commonly-conceived sense of punishment or retribution, but rather restorative justice, the return to the original harmony and order of things.

Baptism plunges us into righteousness. Baptism is the end of our hidden lives. We are to no longer hide in the shadow of sin and the dark valley of death, but rise up to proclaim salvation through the Son. We are to be bearers of the light of the nations, Jesus Christ. Emerging from the waters of baptism, we put on the mind of Christ. We follow His shining example and are enlightened by His teachings, handed by the Church through the apostles and their successors down to our own day.

When this Mass - and each Mass - is ended, as we exit the church and wet our fingertips with holy water, may we be reminded of our Baptism, refreshed in our resolve to bring the light of Christ to the world, and rededicated to our share in Jesus' own mission of restoration, justice and peace.

The Baptism of the Lord (C)

Is 42:1–4, 6–7 or Is 40:1–5, 9–11

Acts 10:34–38 or Ti 2:11–14; 3:4–7

Lk 3:15–16, 21–22

Renewal by the Holy Spirit

We have all received baptism, but why don't the amazing fruits and graces received then always show themselves powerfully in our lives?

Titus tells us what has already happened for us in baptism. We were saved “through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit” (3:5). Yet this renewal accomplished by the Spirit needs to be fully embraced by us for it to reach its potential. We know we have been renewed, but how do we keep renewing? This happens by prayerful contact with the Holy Spirit.

In Titus, Spirit is capitalized because it's the Spirit of God. Renewal by the Holy Spirit is a renewal in which God, not man, is the principal protagonist. “Behold, I” (not you) “make all things new” (Revelation 21:5).

We often think that to be renewed and grow, we have to do something. God tells us it is something he does. “I, the LORD, make you holy” (Leviticus 20:8). We have to give him back the power he already has. Or better yet, we need to recognize God's power and let him use it in us.

A revolution needs to happen in our minds and hearts where we recognize that without the Holy Spirit we can do nothing. So ask the Holy Spirit to come upon you in a real baptism of fire. Then all those baptismal gifts will spark into a flame and help you set the world ablaze with his love!
