
JANUARY 26, 2020 THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ONLY CREDIBLE WITNESSES CAN BRING OTHERS TO JESUS CHRIST...

When Jesus began His public ministry of preaching and healing, John the Baptist had already been arrested, putting an end to John's movement of religious revival. At that point, Jesus went to Capernaum. This marked a new beginning, whose purpose is described: "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who lived in the land of the shadow of death, light has dawned." Jesus' message was very like that of John the Baptist. "Turn from your sins, and turn back to God, because the kingdom of heaven is near."

The central message of today's readings could be summed up in three points. 1) As Christians, we are called to unity which requires true conversion of heart and mind towards God and other fellow Christians. 2) As long as Christians remain divided, their witness will continue to be weak, a scandal and unconvincing. 3) Unity between Christians can be a powerful instrument for ending divisions, no matter how deep, and conflicts, no matter how vicious, and help lead to peace, unity and reconciliation in the Church and in the world. Think about it.

The first reading gives an example of the kingdom established by David being torn apart by divisions soon after Solomon's death. Consequently, foreigners invaded the Northern Kingdom in 733-32 BC, occupied it, and further threatened the Southern Kingdom of Judah. For centuries darkness reigned all over Israel. But then comes the prophesy of a great light in time to come. Great joy and happiness would be restored. A king of peace would come to establish freedom and unify Israel forever.



The second reading gives another example of divisions in the Christian community of Corinth. Paul reminds the Christians there that they belong to Christ, and not to any particular apostle who may have baptized them. It is the death and Resurrection of Christ symbolized in their Baptism, which binds them together as a Christian community.

In the Gospel, Matthew shows that Jesus is the fulfilment of Isaiah's prophecy. Jesus Christ is the Light of the world and the source of unity in a world that is very much focused only on individual needs and not the needs of all. Political and ideological differences, regional and civil wars, ethnic conflicts and Christian divisions continue to cast a deep shadow over the world. Our Christian faith and hope, however, tell us that someday a great light will indeed shine and unity will be restored. The source of that light and unity is Jesus Christ. "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." That message is a wake-up call for all of us. As disciples of Christ we must give authentic witness to Jesus and work for unity in a world overshadowed by the darkness of human pride, greed and selfishness. If we are credible witnesses, others will want to become Christian.

Is Christ Divided?

“You’re breaking the back of the body of Christ!” Saint Paul might have said this to members of the Corinthian community who rival each other, claiming that the leader who baptized them is greater than the one who baptized others: “I belong to Paul...I belong to Apollos...I belong to Cephas” (1 Corinthians 1:12). This suggests that, based on their baptizer, the members themselves are superior. Such rivalry sounds so petty. We should be careful here, because some of this rivalry still exists in the Church.

In any healthy group there will be diverse opinions. We all have our own tastes, preferences, cultural habits, and so on. This is true in church music, preaching style, and religious devotion. The uniformity of the Church prior to the Second Vatican Council has given way to great diversity. What is different is not necessarily bad. Nor is our preference necessarily superior. Such diversity need not pit us against each other, but sometimes it does. Is Christ divided over points of preference?

We are all part of the body of Christ; we are all God’s beloved. The diversity among us challenges us to work toward the common good, to “be united in the same mind and in the same purpose” (1 Corinthians 1:10). Let us not divide Christ.
