GOSPEL REFLECTION

JULY 26, 2020

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

SEEK FOR WISDOM; A TREASURE FOR ETERNITY.

In the gospel of Matthew, Jesus always compared the Kingdom of God with people's customs and way of living based on their past experiences. He spoke in parables and for people to understand His message, they needed special wisdom from God. Wisdom is a special gift that can help us to achieve whatever we need in life. It is a special treasure that brings happiness and joy to a person's heart. And in our world, there is only one treasure that can give us this happiness and that is Jesus Christ. Jesus is the wisdom of God that enables leaders to lead wisely, that makes people good husbands and wives to become good parents and also makes us good human beings.



In the first two parables of the gospel this weekend, the men sold everything they had to acquire something precious that they were lacking. They made risky decisions that eventually paid off. We too must search for Christ; our treasure. Searching for Jesus means that we must face tough choices to make decisions that are sometimes hard. We must accept to carry our daily Crosses in order to find Jesus. This could be fulfilling our responsibilities in our families, living according to Church teachings amidst the liberal society and being there for those in need. By carrying out these sacrifices, we shall discover the hidden treasure, which is Jesus Himself.



King Solomon gives us a better example by not relying on human power but asking for God's wisdom in order to discern between good and evil. His request was not to achieve personal pleasure, but for the betterment of his people. Of course, there will always be passing treasures that are tempting but cannot offer us long lasting happiness. You may be tempted to be selfish with your resources, your time, knowledge and think that you are happy. All these things can pass away, but with love and compassion for others, you will experience Jesus in your heart and get everlasting joy.

The question now is; how do I begin the journey to achieve this wisdom or attain this treasure? It all begins from your heart. You begin by praying constantly like Solomon did and frequently receiving the sacraments as instituted by Christ, and not forgetting to read the scriptures to nourish your soul. Then you can attain the happiness talked about in the parable (Matt 13:44). If you want that experience, focus on the Cross of Christ and not on yourself. Jesus offered His life for our sake and there is no one who loves you like Him. Spend time with Jesus in adoration, contemplating on His love for you and extend that love to others. For Solomon prayed for wisdom to lead his people better and you can also pray for the same wisdom to live with others better.

been essential in my direction as pastor, especially local charities, so I am thrilled that we have a vibrant, ongoing effort in this area.

I loved the Warrior Weekend to Remember program where we say "Thank you" to a Purple Heart veteran with a special care package and prayers, to let them know that we truly appreciate what they have done for our country.

The Father Dan Schuh Center is the hub of our charitable activity. The Food Drive coming up in September helps keep our food pantry stocked to provide needed groceries for many families in our area. We also participate in the Food For All program, an Archdiocesan effort of mobile food pantries throughout southwest Ohio.

I'm looking forward to the charitable events we have on the calendar, such as the Thanksgiving Dinner, Christmas Town for the Schuh Center patrons, Easter Basket Drive, Mother's Day Flower collection, and especially the Pancake Breakfast, which provides fellowship amongst the parishioners while providing the "seed" money for the Thanksgiving Dinner Ministry.

There are so many works of charity right here for our community around St. Susanna's and Mason; like the Charitable Computer Ministry (CCM) which provides free used computers to local charities. How many computer programmers do we have in our parish who could lend a hand with this work?

The Peanut Butter Ministry is a direct help for our homeless brothers and sisters who need a nutritious lunch. Groups of volunteers meet at 9:00am on Sunday mornings in the Schuh Center and prepare lunches which are taken to downtown Cincinnati for distribution.

The Rosary Ministry is a great work where you can meet in the church basement on the first and third Wednesdays after morning Mass and do this simple yet profound service for the Church.

There are many more opportunities to serve others in our parish. I hope we can continue to do these works of charity. Please continue to support them and to maybe see in your own heart an opportunity to serve by volunteering in one of these.

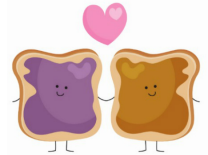

Through the generous donations of St. Susanna parishioners, funds have been raised to help provide food for 1,400 families who are in need because of the COVID lockdown in their country. Each family received a bag of corn flour and a bag of beans. At this time, Fr. Richard Ssebugwawo, pastor of OLPH, has identified 600 additional families in need of food. The amount needed to feed 600 families is \$5,343 or \$9.00/family. We will continue to collect donations through August.



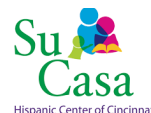

Wising Up

There are various kinds of wisdom: the kind you get by watching carefully to discover how something works, or by learning from a mistake; the wisdom in taking advice from someone and not making the mistake he made; the political, social, or religious wisdom learned by those who work in these vocations. There is also wisdom that is just beyond our reach, the kind that is found only in God.

This Sunday's readings discuss various kinds of wisdom. King Solomon asks for "a listening heart" (1 Kings 3:9), the knowledge needed to rule his people wisely. He is told he can ask for anything: long life, riches, security from his enemies, all blessings that would certainly benefit him. Instead he asks for something to benefit his people. It seems he is wise enough to know he needs such wisdom. The psalm response praises the law, the religious tradition that provides instruction for living a life of holiness and thus reaping the rewards of such a life.

The parable in the Gospel describes various life situations in which decisions have to be made. In the first two instances, a question is posed: What is the kingdom of heaven worth to you? What are you willing to give up in order to attain it? The third depicts fishing with a net, a very strenuous task. A question here might be: Are you willing to work hard at this? Are you discerning in separating good actions from bad? It takes real wisdom to answer such questions.
