SEPTEMBER 27, 2020 TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

BE HUMBLE AS YOUR HEAVENLY FATHER.

For the last few weeks, we have been reflecting on God's mercy and compassionate love to His people. This weekend, we are challenged to redirect that kindness and love to our brothers and sisters, putting their interests beyond ourselves following the example of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are expected to have the same attitude as Jesus who humbled Himself from His divine status and emptied Himself to become a human being like us in all things except sin.

He offered Himself to serve humanity through obedience to His Father's will, to the extent of dying for us on the cross because of our sins. However, His self-sacrifice and death were not in vain, but He was exalted above all creatures through the mystery of the Resurrection, on which our faith rotates. This is the same Jesus that calls upon us to imitate Him. He is still living in us and speaks to us everyday as the Word of God through whom we are expected to respond to whatever God tells us to do.

As followers of Christ, He calls each one of us to be part of the team that works in the Father's vineyard. And this vineyard could be the Church, your family or the society in which your services, input or assistance are needed. But how do you always respond to those assignments, requests or voices that call for your involvement to serve others? Do you normally respond like the first son in the parable or the second?



Obviously, there are moments when we feel that we are heavily burdened and get discouraged about fulfilling certain responsibilities or assignments in our respective areas of service. There are moments we have made promises to our families, Church and society, but in the end, neglected them. In all these circumstances, let us always look at our Savior who embraced His cross without complaining, and carried it to win salvation for us. This calls for humility before God and one another. It may be difficult for some of us because pride is so rooted in our hearts, to the extent that we sometimes find it difficult to change our decisions, even when we eventually realize they were wrong, and we cannot say sorry.

But we know that, through the grace of God, we can conquer this pride and be the people that God wants us to be for His Kingdom. With Christ, we can change all our past life, be made new and worthy to be in His presence, to be called sons and daughters of God. Let us empty ourselves of our past mistakes and support each other on this journey of faith, without focusing on our own past and that of our brothers and sisters. For Christ does not look for the righteous, but for a sinner who repents his/her sins.





THE FEAST OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL IS SEPTEMBER 27TH

- St. Vincent de Paul was born at Pouy, France on April 24, 1581. He was ordained a priest on September 23, 1600. Vincent devoted himself entirely to the alleviation of the sufferings of the poor, and to that purpose established the Confraternities of Charity, later known as the Ladies of Charity, in 1617. In 1625, he founded the Congregation of the Mission, his community of priests and brothers. With Louise de Marillac, he co-founded the Daughters of Charity in 1633. Vincent died in Paris on September 27, 1660 and was canonized in 1737. Pope Leo XIII declared him patron saint of all works of charity.



What do you and your family pray for? It is often easy to ask God for help in our own lives. As important as it is to pray and speak with God about our personal struggles, it is also essential to pray for those around us, even if we do not know them!

We can pray for other people whenever and wherever the moment strikes us. For example, pray when:

- An ambulance drives past you
- Someone is asking for money
- A person is seeking food or shelter
- Seeing a stranger cry
- Someone who seems to be stressed out

Whatever the case may be, there are opportunities around you every day to help those around you through your silent prayers. When you witness such an occasion, simply say: "Immaculate Mary, pray for this person, that God may bestow all the blessings and graces that they need." And then conclude with the Hail Mary.

LEARN A NEW PRAYER!

Have your family include The Magnificat in your daily prayers this week. Scripture contains this prayer of Mary's joy and wonder at her role in the mystery of the Incarnation. The Church recites this beautiful prayer daily at Evening Prayer (Vespers) in the Liturgy of the Hours.

My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. And his mercy is on those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm, he has scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts, he has put down the mighty from their thrones, and exalted those of low degree; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent empty away. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his posterity for ever. (Luke 1:46-55)

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW)





He Emptied Himself

n the Gospels, Jesus seldom teaches doctrine.
Rather, the stories themselves provide examples of how we are to model our lives after him. He was a man for others, a compassionate healer, an understanding friend. As clear as such stories might be, because we can be selfish people, the example they offer us is difficult to follow. If it is hard to follow a man who lived a human life with others, how are we to follow the example sketched by Paul in today's second reading?

Paul declares in Philippians: "Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus" (2:5). What attitude is he talking about? Jesus emptied himself of the preeminence that was rightly his as possessing "equality with God" (2:6). He did not demand that they treat him with the reverence and veneration that was due him. Rather, "he emptied himself...he humbled himself" (2:7, 8).

Why does Paul insist on this? It seems the Philippians were having internal problems that were threatening their unity. Various forms of arrogance were tearing them apart: Don't you know who I am? I am a celebrity. I have more money. I know the right people. And who are you? Who do you know? What can you do? These attitudes of arrogance infect our communities even today. To this Paul proclaims: If Jesus, who "though he was in the form of God" (2:6) could empty himself of such dignity for the sake of others, you certainly should be able to put aside your trivial vainglory and be "united in heart" (2:2).

Can we?
