### January 10, 2021 The Baptism of the Lord

This is My Beloved Son, Listen to Him.

On New Year's Day, I was excited to preside over the Baptism of seven children, all of whom are my relatives. It was a joyful day for the whole church in Nyamitanga and my family. As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we are all reminded of our own baptismal calling, to make a change to the world.

We hear in the Gospels how God annointed His son to heal the sick and save the world as evidenced at His Baptism. God revealed that mission to the world, something we also shared at our Baptism.

We know that John was already baptizing people, preparing for the Messiah. However, his Baptism was an invitation for the people to come and confess their own sins and turn to God. His Baptism with water continues to be a symbol for us to go down into the waters and be washed clean, something that all of us are called to embrace in this new year.

Since John's Baptism was for people who recognized their need for God, this is what we are all called to do. Because of this, John was hesitant to accept baptizing Jesus because He had no sin and so He needed no cleansing.

He did so to give us an example of how to embrace new life and God's mission and receive forgiveness. He would later take all our guilt and pain on the Cross. That's why we believe that, through our own Baptism we too share in Christ's death and Resurrection.

When water is poured out on a child, a covenant with God the Father is made through the Son and the person receives new life, thus a new beginning.

And so, we not only celebrate Christ's Baptism but also God's gracious coming among us. As we begin this year, let us have new hope and faith in the Lord, put behind all the fears and anxieties of 2020. Let our actions bring change to our lives and the lives of others. Since are all beloved sons and daughters of God, He will only be pleased if we live according to our baptismal promises with hope, love and faith in the year 2021.

#### **Need Low-Gluten Hosts?**



Low-gluten hosts are available at all Masses for Holy Communion. If you would like to

receive a low-gluten host, stop by the Sacristy prior to Mass and ask one of the Mass Coordinators to set it up for you.

When Communion is distributed, go to the priest's line and say "low-gluten," and he will give it to you. If you or your child is a regular low-gluten host recipient, you are encouraged to introduce yourself to Father Barry. We want everyone to enjoy the benefits of Holy Communion, so don't hesitate to ask. Please know that the Church does not provide gluten-free hosts.



The start of a new year brings a lot of promise and hope. We make a lot of promises to be better people and we hope we can follow through on them. Don't get me wrong, making New Year's resolutions is a very good thing

to do. But most of the time, if we aren't working on things consistently throughout the year, we probably won't make good on our resolutions.

There is one New Year's resolution I think we all need to make. And that is to live in the state of grace from this day forward. Really, it's to live a "life of grace," a life in union with God. The first step is to examine your life and see where you are objectively with God and the Church. Are you baptized? Check. Have you received First Communion? Check. Have you been confirmed? Check. Have you been going to Sunday Mass each week? Is your marriage valid in the Catholic Church? This is vital because there are people who have been divorced and remarried outside the Church, which puts them objectively outside of the grace of God. A Catholic must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage. If you have any questions about your marital situation, please see a priest immediately. The Church can help with the annulment process if needed (which doesn't cost a thing anymore).


Finally, you have to see if you have committed a mortal sin, a grave offense that you know is serious and you willfully did. Sins such as these literally kill the soul, hence the term "mortal." They take away the gift of sanctifying grace (the grace given at Baptism that makes you holy and saves you). Only through sacramental Confession can that grace be restored. If you discover you have committed such a sin, you must refrain from receiving Holy Communion. That would be a sacrilegious Communion, since by your sin you are not in communion with Christ who you are receiving. But remember, just because you can't receive Holy Communion in the state of mortal sin, you still must go to Mass and try to get to Confession as soon as possible. Use a good examination of conscience to prepare for Confession. If you are not sure if it was a mortal sin, talk to the priest in Confession. It's better to be safe than sorry in the matter of the gravity of a sin.

One situation today that presents a difficulty in living a life of grace is unmarried couples living together before they get married. I know there are economic reasons for doing this, especially if the couple is engaged. But really, they are putting their souls in jeopardy by being in an occasion of mortal sin. Having sexual relations outside of marriage is a mortal sin. Jesus and the Church are very clear on this. Why would you want to be in mortal sin with the person you are going to be married to and try to help to get to Heaven, just because you want to save a few bucks? I was shocked by the number of couples living together before marriage. Do they know the danger they are putting their souls and their future marriage in? I, as a priest and pastor, can't be silent on this. I must speak out against what has become the status quo for Catholic couples. Their souls are too important.

I hope we all will examine our lives as we begin this new year, and make a firm resolution to live a life of grace from now on. An eternity in Heaven or Hell is on the line. With the same care and attention we put towards our physical health, we should do even more for our spiritual health.

On December 8th, Pope Francis declared this will be the Year of Saint Joseph! (Remember, the New Liturgiucal Year/Calendar for the Catholic Church begins every Advent.) Spend some time this week as a family talking about St. Joseph! May each family, especially fathers, cultivate a speacial devotion to him!



#### Who is Saint Joseph?

St. Joseph was the husband of Mary, the mother of Jesus. According to the earliest Christian traditions, he was a carpenter or woodworker. The Gospel of Matthew calls him a "righteous man," meaning he was an observant Jew who obeyed God's law.

Joseph was engaged to Mary, but when he discovered that she was pregnant with Jesus, he decided to call off the marriage - but "quietly," since the penalty for adultery was death by stoning.

However, the angel of the Lord told him in a dream that he should go ahead with the marriage because Mary's child was conceived by the Holy Spirit.

This was the first of four divinely inspired dreams that are recorded in the Gospel of Matthew; for this reason, he is sometimes called "the dreamer." After each of these dreams, "he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him" (Matthew 1:24).

The Gospel of Luke tells us that when Jesus was twelve, Joseph took Him and Mary to Jerusalem to visit the Temple. They became separated, and Mary and Joseph spent three days looking for Him. When they found Him, Mary said to Jesus: "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." In reply, Jesus said: "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Luke 2:48-49)

Mary referred to Joseph as Jesus' father, honoring his role in caring for and protecting Jesus, and raising Him in the Jewish faith; the reply of Jesus refers to God as His Father, and introduces a common theme in His preaching: Our faithfulness to God must come before even our closest human relationships.

The Solemnity of St. Joseph is celebrated on March 19th (or the next available date, if it falls on a Sunday). He is also honored as the patron saint of workers on May 1st.

Feast Day: March 19th

Attributes: Carpenter's square or tools, the infant Jesus, staff with lily blossoms, two turtle doves, rod of spikenard.

Patronage: Catholic Church, unborn children, fathers, immigrants, workers, employment, traveler, carpenters, realtors, against doubt and hesitation, and of a happy death.


A sudden stab of pain shot through Joseph's finger.

En la Fiesta del Bautismo Jesús nos recuerda nuestro Bautismo, y nos alienta a vivir nuestro bautismo en constante unión con Él. 


