April 4, 2021 Easter Sunday

Alleluia, Alleluia! He is Risen as He Said.

When England went to war with Napoleon at the battle of Waterloo, the British placed a sign at the bell tower of a Church to remind people on how the war was progressing. One morning, the sign was partly obstructed by the fog and people could read "England Defeated." Whoever read this felt devastated and defeated until the fog cleared and the whole sign could be read as "England Defeated Napoleon." From that moment, people's sorrows turned into joy as they began to celebrate their victory over the enemy. Similarly, when Jesus died on the Cross on good Friday, His followers felt lost and defeated. They lost hope for a bright future that He had preached to them, but in just a couple of days, their sorrow turned into joy when the women found an empty tomb and the angel told them that He had risen. All their hopelessness was consumed by Jesus' victory over death. People who had been consumed by the darkness of death, received the light of the Risen Lord and took this good news to all the others.

And so, on this Easter Sunday, we celebrate that victory over death which no longer has power over us who believe in Christ, but just a process through which we pass, to our victory from the suffering of this world. This reminds us that, there is a bright future in store for us, as we transit from this passing world and focus on the Spiritual world which does not pass away. That's why St. Paul exhorts us: "If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God" (Col 3:1-2). But ask yourself; as I live in this world, where am I heading



to after completing my journey? The answer is that, just like the women who went to the tomb to search for Jesus, we too must always keep searching for Him with hope even when we are in our darkest moments of life. These women never expect to find an empty tomb but because they had trusted and waited in faith, they were given a surprise of their lives. They became the first bearers of the good news about Christ's victory over death and blessed with peace and newness of life. This is what all of us should search for. If Jesus had not risen from the dead and appeared to these women, we would never have heard of Him. And so, this is fundamental to our faith. Christ's Resurrection gives us the mandate to be His witnesses. As He commanded His disciples to go and make disciples of all nations (Mt 28:19-20)., we too are sent to spread that good news to others, beginning from our own families, places of work and all those we encounter every day. Jesus tells us, "I am the resurrection and anyone who believes in me, even though that person dies, will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die" (Jn 11:25-26).

Dear friends, unlike the disciples who saw the empty tomb and believed, our evidence today is in the Scriptures. Let us find hope in the words of Jesus to Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." This truth should give us hope, and assurance of our final victory and eternal salvation. Happy Easter to you all and God bless you. Christ is Risen.

Happy Easter! And congratulations to all who received the Sacraments this year from our parish, our Archdiocese, and around our country. We are building the Kingdom of God and the Body of Christ. Let's all continue to

move forward in our faith, growing in grace with every new day.

Next weekend is Divine Mercy Sunday. We will have a special Holy Hour with Rosary recited and Chaplet of Divine Mercy sung for all parishioners, English-speaking and Hispanic. This will begin at 2:00pm and will be followed by the Mass in Spanish at 4:00pm.

This is a very special day given to us as a pure gift of God through the work of Pope St. John Paul II, offering the abundant grace of God to all who participate in the feast day of Divine Mercy. Jesus promises that the person who has been to Confession and receives Holy Communion on that day will be completely wiped clean of the stain of sin on their soul and freed from the punishment because of their sins. The special grace promised by our Lord for Divine Mercy Sunday is nothing less than a complete renewal of baptismal grace in the soul. Amazing Grace! How sweet the sound!

There is no limit to the merciful love of God which Christ won for us by His death and Resurrection. The Church, as the official dispenser of this grace, has an infinite treasury at her disposal. God desires us to swim in His grace and spares no expense that we should have easy access to it. That is Divine Mercy! The Church, the Body of Christ, is the instrument, the faucet, that we can turn on and gain that grace of God won for us by Christ.

This next Sunday is a more recent addition to the Church's tools to grant God's grace. St. Faustina's visions of Christ as Divine Mercy in the 1930's was the start of it, and Pope St. John Paul II, guided by the Holy Spirit, launched it out in 2002 into the Universal Church.

So, there is no excuse for anybody going without the grace of God. The faucet is always on. The well is always overflowing and gushing out the life-giving waters of salvation. Don't be like the man who during a storm and flood chose not to get in the police car and go to safety; he said, 'God will save me.' When the waters started to rise, he went to the upstairs floor of his house, and refused to get in the boat that would take him away; 'God will save me.' Then, going up on the roof when the waters got even higher, he refused to get in the helicopter that came down to rescue him; 'God will save me'. When he drowned and came to the Pearly Gates, he complained to St. Peter that God never came to help him. St. Peter, a bit exasperated, asked him, 'Hey, God sent you a police car, a boat, and even a helicopter, why didn't you get in one of these!'

The Church offers so many ways and tools to help us on the way to salvation; so many means of gaining God's grace. Why don't we take advantage of them? Come to the services on Divine Mercy Sunday, Mass and Holy Hour. Receive Holy Communion; go to Confession. Bask in the grace of God freely given.

We will also enjoy guided tours of Albuquerque, Santa Fe, Acoma Pueblo and many other historical and unique features of the area. 

iAleluya, Aleluya! Ha Resucitado Como Él Dijo.

Cuando Inglaterra fue a la guerra con Napoleón en la batalla de Waterloo, los británicos colocaron un letrero en el campanario de una Iglesia para recordar a la gente cómo avanzaba la guerra. Una mañana, el letrero estaba parcialmente obstruido por la niebla y la gente podía leer "Inglaterra Derrotada". Quien leyera esto se sintió devastado y derrotado hasta que la niebla se despejó y todo el letrero se podía leer como "Inglaterra Derrotó a Napoleón". A partir de ese momento, las penas de la gente se convirtieron en alegría y comenzaron a celebrar su victoria sobre el enemigo. Del mismo modo, cuando Jesús murió en la Cruz el viernes santo, sus seguidores se sintieron perdidos y derrotados. Perdieron la esperanza de un futuro brillante que Él les había predicado, pero justo en un par de días, su dolor se convirtió en alegría cuando las mujeres encontraron una tumba vacía y el ángel les dijo que Él había resucitado. Toda su desesperanza fue consumida por la victoria de Jesús sobre la muerte. Las personas que habían sido consumidas por la oscuridad de la muerte recibieron la luz del Señor resucitado y llevaron esta buena noticia a todos los demás.

Y así, en este Domingo de Pascua, celebramos esa victoria sobre la muerte que ya no tiene poder sobre nosotros los que creemos en Cristo, sino sólo un proceso por el que pasamos, a nuestra victoria del sufrimiento de este mundo. 

Seeing Is Believing

Lever phrase. But is it accurate? Believing means that we sometimes accept as true something for which we have no positive proof. We might base our belief on the word of someone we consider reliable, but we ourselves have no undeniable evidence. We may use this phrase in everyday conversation and know what we really mean, but when it comes to the resurrection of Jesus, the phrase "seeing is believing" really doesn't fit well.

In today's first reading, Peter states that Jesus was visible to some of his followers. What does this mean? It's clear from most of the Easter narratives that many people had a profound, life-transforming experience of the risen Jesus. They may not have realized this at first, but they were convinced of it when he allowed them to recognize him. Was it a visual experience? Was it auditory as Paul describes (Acts 9:4)? Or was it

touch as Thomas demanded (John 20:25)? Every mystic describes a revelation of Christ as an experience of one or more senses. For example, St. Bernadette saw our Lady, while St. Francis heard a voice. This isn't to say that the revelations weren't real. It is to say that our senses are our only way of experiencing it or talking about it. We are, after all, only human.

Maybe when referring to the resurrection we should modify this phrase: believing is seeing or hearing or feeling or being somehow convinced that he is really here. And this can be true for all of us.
