GOSPEL REFLECTION

May 30, 2021 The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Go, and Baptize in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Since ancient times, human beings have worshipped different gods. For example, the Romans worshipped gods like Venus, Mars, Jupiter, etc. However, the people of Israel were unique among all nations. They had only one God who revealed Himself to Abraham thousands of years before Christ, though they were not always faithful to Him. They were sometimes influenced by their pagan neighbors into idolatry, which often attracted God's wrath.

In this Sunday's first reading, Moses declares to the people that there is no other God than the Lord, through only whom they can prosper. This is the God who fully revealed Himself to the world through His Son Jesus Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit. On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we celebrate God's love to the world through His Son, which He continues to shower upon us by the working of the Holy Spirit.

The concept of the Trinity is the basic mystery behind all other mysteries of our faith. It reveals to us the unity of one God in three distinct persons and their roles. The Father (creator) sent the Son (redeemer) to save us by His life, and then the Father and the Son sent us the Holy Spirit (sanctifier) to fill us with divine life and make us God's children. This is why, every day during



Mass, we honor God our Father through His Son Jesus Christ in unity with the Holy Spirit. This may not be so easy to grasp, and that is why, every day, we must continue searching for God in our lives so that we can know Him better.

When Christ commanded His disciples to go and baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son and the Holy Spirit, He wanted us all to be joined to the Trinitarian family. And so, after our Baptism, we began a journey to the Father in our different vocations. We follow the example of the Son who teaches us who the Father is, and we get this knowledge with the help of the Holy Spirit. The love and unity between the three is what we all are called to embrace and practice in our everyday lives.

Dear friends, we need to take the Holy Trinity as the model for our Christian families - replicating how the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are united in love. The love, unity and joy in their relationship should inspire us in our own relationships with one another. You are only a true Christian by living in a good relationship with God and others.

Like God the Father, we are called upon to be creative and productive. Like God the Son, we are called upon to reconcile and be peace makers. Like God the Holy Spirit, we are called upon to teach and tell the truth to the world especially those in our care.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you always.

If you are looking for somewhere to go this summer that's not so far away, then look no farther than the Relic Shrine at Maria Stein, Ohio, under two hours away from Mason. The Relic Shrine is an amazing Catholic site, with hundreds

of relics of the saints in a beautiful chapel. The shrine used to be the convent of the Sisters of the Precious Blood. Located in the farmlands of northwest Ohio, close to my hometown of Minster, you can experience "God's Country" in person. The area is dotted with small Catholic churches which remain open for visitors during the day.

You could start your tour in Minster, visiting St. Augustine Church where I was baptized. It is a gorgeous church with a barrel-vaulted ceiling covered with beautiful paintings. Then head over to Maria Stein, and visit St. John's Church, which was recently repainted inside. Then go over to the Shrine of the Holy Relics down the street. Visit the chapel and see the relics of hundreds of saints. Look up your namesake on the computer and see if they are there. Pray for your special intentions as you light a candle.



They have a very interesting museum which shows the development of the Catholic Church in the area, along with the history of the Precious Blood Congregation. Next, visit the Spiritual Center retreat house and walk the Rosary path through the woods. It is a very peaceful place.

After this, you can drive west on the country roads and see the many little churches in Auglaize and Mercer counties. Stop for lunch in Celina, Ohio, at Pullman Bay Restaurant, and get a piece of homemade pie as you gaze out over Grand Lake St. Marys. Head east to St. Marys, Ohio, and visit my former parish, Holy Rosary Church on Spring Street. Then, drive north a few miles and stop in and see St. Patrick's Church, the most beautiful church in the archdiocese. I was pastor there as well and we did a great job of redecorating it. Finally, head east again to Wapakoneta, Ohio, and visit St. Joseph's Church and see the newly redesigned sanctuary. It is gorgeous. While in Wapak, you can visit the Neil Armstrong Space Museum to round out your day. You'll be right next to I-75, so you can be home in an hour and a half.

I hope you make a trip up north a part of your summer plans. If you want a longer trip, there are great Marian shrines north of there, one in Carey, Ohio, and the other in Bellevue. Maybe, if you've had enough of King's Island, make these spots a part of a trip to Cedar Point Amusement Park in Sandusky. The coasters there are incredible.

Just so you know, I'm not getting a commission from any of these sites and I'm not a tour company. I just want to give you some new things that are close to home which you can do as a family to help you in your life of faith.

Obligation Restored

The Catholic Conference of Ohio has released a statement lifting of the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Mass. In line with that statement, Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr has decreed that for the faithful of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati the obligation to attend



Sunday and Holy Day Mass is reinstated, beginning the weekend of June 5th/6th, 2021.

In addition, in line with our guidance throughout this pandemic to follow the regulations of public health authorities, after the statewide mandate has been lifted (currently scheduled for June 2nd), there will be no mask mandate for churches of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Wedding Coordinator Ministry

If you feel more comfortable, you may clean the kneeler with the sanitizing wipes before kneeling down. Take advantage of this secret to a healthy life, mentally and spiritually, and come to the Sacrament of Confession.


Volunteers are needed before the sale for setup, sorting and pricing; during the 2-day sale to help with checkout; and after the sale to dismantle tables and load leftover

St. Susanna's St. Vincent de Paul Conference Seeking Vincentians

St. Susanna is very fortunate to have an active and thriving St. Vincent de Paul Conference. It consists of a group of about 20 volunteers, called Vincentians, who respond to individuals in need right here within our parish boundaries. We typically help with utility bills, rent, gas, lodging, prescriptions, plumbing issues, car repairs, and school supplies. Vincentians work closely with the Schuh Center to ensure those in need have the food, clothing and household items they often cannot afford. Vincentians also provide referral information to help individuals help themselves.

Vincentians go in groups of two to home visits to individuals calling in for assistance. A home visit is an opportunity to listen and show Christ's love. Our intent is to help on a one-time basis through a crisis or unexpected financial burden. Love is conveyed by showing care, concern and respect. A Vincentian's time commitment typically ranges from two to six hours a month.

Being a Vincentian is a very rewarding experience. We are enriched by fellow members through prayer and support in our bimonthly meetings. It is also a proactive way to respond to those in need in our community.

Reflexión Sobre La Solemnidad De La Santísima Trinidad, 30 De Mayo De 2021

Vayan Y Bautizen En El Nombre Del Padre, Del Hijo Y Del Espíritu Santo.

Desde la antigüedad, los seres humanos han adorado a diferentes dioses. Por ejemplo, los romanos adoraban a dioses como Venus, Marte, Júpiter, etc. Sin embargo, el pueblo de Israel era único entre todas las naciones. Tenían un solo Dios que se reveló a Abraham miles de años antes de Cristo, aunque no siempre le fueron fieles. A veces fueron influenciados por sus vecinos paganos hacia la idolatría que a menudo atraía la ira de Dios. En la primera lectura de este domingo, Moisés declara al pueblo que no hay otro Dios que el Señor, solo a través del cual pueden prosperar. Este es el Dios que se reveló plenamente al mundo a través de Su Hijo Jesucristo, por el poder del Espíritu Santo.

Y así, en esta solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, celebramos el amor de Dios al mundo a través de Su Hijo, que Él continúa derramando sobre nosotros por obra del Espíritu Santo. El concepto de la Trinidad es el misterio básico detrás de todos los demás misterios



de nuestra fe. Nos revela la unidad de un Dios en tres personas distintas y sus roles. 



Wow!

S ome might think that "Wow!" is an inappropriate, even irreverent response, when talking about God. But what words would be appropriate? There are no words, there are no precise doctrinal statements that even come close to identifying God. The readings for today's feast invite us to ponder, not define, this mystery.

The people at the time of Moses had no concept of a Trinitarian God. However, they were convinced that God worked in their lives. They believed they had been delivered from bondage by God, invited into a special relationship with God, and promised by God a long and fruitful life in a land they could call their own. In other words, they were cared for by God, who demonstrated again and again that they were loved. The Gospel story tells of how Jesus entrusted his disciples with the mission he himself had exercised during his lifetime.

What once might have been considered the special privilege of the nation of Israel was now seen as a promise for all nations. All people could now rely on God's care for them and God's ever-present love. Saint Paul identifies this privilege as the Spirit of adoption.

Today's readings may not paint a clear picture of God or provide a precise definition. God is far beyond any picture or definition. However, each reading gives us a glimpse into the way God works in our lives—inviting us into intimacy, caring for us, loving us. Wow!


