# In the Wedding

# Scott Hahn Reflects on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Think of these first weeks after Christmas as a season of "epiphanies." The liturgy is showing us who Jesus is and what He has revealed about our relationship with God.

Last week and the week before, the imagery was royal and filial—Jesus is the newborn King of the Jews who makes us coheirs of Israel's promise, beloved children of God. Last week in the liturgy we went to a Baptism.

This week we're at a wedding.

We're being shown another dimension of our relationship with God. If we're sons and daughters of God, it's because we've married into the family.

Have you ever wondered why the Bible begins and ends with a wedding—Adam and Eve's in the garden and the marriage supper of the Lamb (compare Genesis 2:23–24 and Revelation 19:9; 21:9; 22:17)?



Throughout the Bible, marriage is the symbol of the covenant relationship God desires with His chosen people. He is the groom, humanity His beloved and sought after bride. We see this reflected beautifully in today's First Reading.

When Israel breaks the covenant, she is compared to an unfaithful spouse (see Jeremiah 2:20–36; 3:1–13). But God promises to take her back, to "espouse" her to Him forever in an everlasting covenant (see Hosea 2:18–22).

That's why in today's Gospel, Jesus performs His first public "sign" at a wedding feast.

Jesus is the divine bridegroom (see John 3:29), calling us to His royal wedding feast (see Matthew 22:1–14). By His New Covenant, He will become "one flesh" with all humanity in the Church (see Ephesians 5:21–33). By our Baptism, each of us has been betrothed to Christ as a bride to a husband (see 2 Corinthians 11:2).

The new wine that Jesus pours out at today's feast is the gift of the Holy Spirit given to His bride and body, as today's Epistle says. This is the "salvation" announced to the "families of nations" in today's Psalm.

# **Sunday Collection**

The totals for the January 9, 2022 collection were not available by the print deadline of this bulletin.



"You have saved the best wine until now!" The passage in this week's Gospel, the Wedding at Cana, is an excellent metaphor for renewing marriages in our church and in society. This is how will we stop abortion – by

renewing and building up marriages according to God's design. Only with committed marriages between one man and one woman will we be open to and bring forth new life and we will never choose something as horrifying as killing the pre-born child in the womb.

And we look to Jesus Christ for the way to do this. He attended a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The Twelve Apostles tagged along and drank a lot of wine. They ran out. And it was Mary, our Lord's Mother, who first noticed the potentially embarrassing situation. She told the servants to do what Jesus tells them. So, they begin to draw out water into the large stone jugs. Suddenly, their faces light up and with



widened eyes they fill the jars to the very brim. Why? Because wine was coming out of the pump. A miracle! And the headwaiter makes his comment about saving the best for last.

Christ is concerned about the state of marriage these days. He wants us to know what marriage truly is – a covenant of authentic love which should reflect God's love. By His mystical marriage to the Church, He shows us how marriage should be. He gave His life for His spouse, the Church, as He hung upon the Cross. It was there where He pronounced His wedding vows. That's how spouses are to love one another – totally, unconditionally, faithfully. It's not what you get out of a marriage; it's what you give to a marriage.

And Jesus' self-offering on the Cross brings forth life. The rebirth of Baptism, the new life that it gives, bought with the price of His blood on Good Friday and renewed at every Mass, is the eternal life Christ engenders with the Church. The same with marriage. A marriage can't be just mutual self-giving. If so, the spouses would spend themselves into oblivion. It must also be mutually self-restoring. The new life engendered in children is the answer. So, to destroy this new life through abortion is a negation of the spousal covenant and a deadening of the authentic love of marriage.

We wonder why marriages fall apart? I wouldn't doubt that abortion is the hidden factor in many of them. The same can be said of artificial contraception, which prevents that new life from even happening; a kind of preemptive abortion. Being "open to life" in marriage then becomes essential to the meaningful union of the spouses. Without life, there can be no union. With death, there is division.


Our society needs to re-learn this fundamental truth in order to survive. Without strong marriages, families fall apart. Without families, society will not last. The fight against abortion then is the battle to save our world from destruction.

# Catholic Customs Corner - Holy Water

Water is the lifeblood of the living world. We can't live without water. Water is used to cleanse our bodies. So also, our souls. Creation began with the Spirit of God over the waters, bringing out the land from them. Later, God washed the earth with the waters of the great flood. The Israelites were set free from slavery in Egypt, passing through the waters of the Red Sea, parted by Moses.

Water has played an important part in religious practice. The Jews had their ceremonial washings before worship. So too in the Catholic Church. We use water for our spiritual re-creation or rebirth in Baptism. We are cleansed from sin and are set free from the slavery of sin and death by the waters of Baptism, given the gift sanctifying grace. In Baptism we are "buried" in the water and we rise out of it to new life.

Every Catholic Church has a baptismal font for this purpose, or even a baptismal pool as at St. Susanna. Also, churches have small fonts at the doors with Holy Water, to remind ourselves of our Baptism before we enter into divine worship, which is made possible by our Baptism.



The custom of blessing oneself with Holy Water with

the sign of the cross is an ancient tradition of Church. We use sensible signs to express spiritual realities. And we often call these realities to mind by an action like sprinkling Holy Water.



This can be done at home as well. Having Holy Water available at home to bless family members is a custom that makes the faith real for families and keeps our attention on the important things in life. Small bottles of Holy Water to take home are available in church, near the Blessed Mother shrine. A small donation to cover the cost of the container is all that's asked.

Small Holy Water fonts can be installed in the home at the door to every bedroom. Babies can be blessed every night using the small bottle of Holy Water provided at their Baptism. Parents can bless their children with Holy Water before they go to school. It a powerful protection against evil for them and a great sign of a parent's love for them in the domestic church of the home.

# Scott Hahn reflexiona sobre el segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Piense en estas primeras semanas después de Navidad como una temporada de "epifanías". La liturgia nos está mostrando quién es Jesús y lo que Él ha revelado acerca de nuestra relación con Dios.

La semana pasada y la semana anterior, las imágenes eran reales y filiales: Jesús es el rey recién nacido de los judíos que nos hace coherederos de la promesa de Israel, hijos amados de Dios. La semana pasada en la liturgia fuimos a un bautismo.

Esta semana estamos en una boda.

Se nos está mostrando otra dimensión de nuestra relación con Dios. Si somos hijos e hijas de Dios, es porque nos hemos casado con la familia.



¿Alguna vez te has preguntado por qué la Biblia comienza y termina con una boda: Adán y Eva están en el jardín y la cena de bodas del Cordero (compara Génesis 2:23-24 y Apocalipsis 19:9; 21:9; 22:17)?

A lo largo de la Biblia, el matrimonio es el símbolo de la relación de pacto que Dios desea con Su pueblo escogido. Él es el novio. la humanidad su novia amada y buscada. Vemos esto reflejado maravillosamente en la Primera Lectura de hov.

Y miramos a Jesucristo en busca de la manera de hacer esto. Asistió a una boda en Caná en Galilea. Los Doce Apóstoles lo acompañaron y bebieron mucho vino. Se les terminó. Y fue María, la Madre de nuestro Señor, la primera que notó la situación potencialmente embarazosa. Ella les dijo a los siervos que hicieran lo que Jesús les dijera. Entonces, comienzan a vaciar agua en las grandes tinajas de piedra. De repente, sus rostros se iluminan y con los ojos muy abiertos llenan las jarras hasta el borde. ¿Por qué? Porque era vino lo que salía de la bomba. ¡Un milagro! Y el mayordomo hace su comentario sobre quardar lo mejor para el final.

Cristo está preocupado por el estado del matrimonio en estos días. Él quiere que sepamos lo que realmente es el matrimonio: un pacto de amor auténtico que debe reflejar el amor de Dios.
