Gospel Reflection

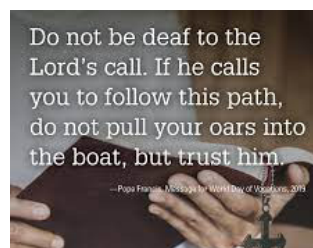
November 6, 2022 • Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

"To What Vocation In Life Is God Calling Me?"

Every year the Catholic Church in the United States dedicates the first Sunday of November to celebrate the beginning of National Vocation Awareness Week. This year, from November 6th-12th, a week-long celebration dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer, education and to renew our support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations.



National Vocation Awareness Week began in 1976, when the US Catholic bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year to this cause. In 1997, the celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on January 13th. However, beginning in 2014, the day was moved to the first full week of November of every year to be celebrated in all the families and Parishes throughout the country.



Our Baptismal call is to lead a life of holiness and love and each one of us lives out this in various ways, through a vocation that might entail ordination to the priesthood, religious, married or single life or a commitment to a particular ministry. This means that God calls us to serve Him in different ways which we take as our vocations. He calls and addresses us personally and we are expected to respond with a YES through our faith which we exhibit through service. "Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him and to which God has called him" (1 Cor. 7:17).

We come to know our vocations from God first, by personally reflecting on our lives through prayer. One must have some moments of silence to think about his/her life and reflect on what you can do best in your life to serve God among His people. From this deep reflection comes the people around us to affirm God's call in our lives. God's voice may come through expressions of our parents, family and friends, teachers and even strangers. That's when people begin to ask you if you have ever considered to become a priest, a deacon or a religious brother/sister. That's why during this week you are invited to encourage your son/daughter, grandchild, students, friends or even your husband to be open if God calls them to priesthood, religious life or as a permanent deacon.

Therefore, the duty of promoting vocations is for all of us beginning from our homes. If we have good and committed parents to their faith, then we may see an increase to vocations to priesthood and religious life. We need to have strong Christian families in our nation anchored on the gospel values. Parents and adults must be good examples so that we lead the young ones to God. The mother described in the first reading (2 Mc 7:1-2, 9-14) gave courage to her seven sons to remain strong in faith by accompanying them to reject the demands of the king which were against their religious beliefs. As we too go through our journey of faith, we have to stand firm and encourage our children to offer their lives as they make hard decisions to serve Him as priests and religious, just as the seven brothers gave up their lives for the salvation of their souls.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading to "pray so that the word of the Lord may speed forward and be glorified, as it did among you" (2 Thes 2:16-3:5), let us not forget always to recite the prayer for vocations so that young men and women can respond with a generous YES to spread the Word of God. We continue to pray for the souls of all the faithful departed to RIP.

From the Pastor's Desk



Next weekend we will be hosting a company from Bethlehem in Israel who makes and sells religious items carved out of olive wood. When I visited the Holy Land back in 2007, I got the chance to see the actual craftsmen at work. Bethlehem is located a few miles south of Jerusalem. It is a very poor area due to the ongoing conflict between Jews and Muslims. The little open shops line the street in Bethlehem with piles of sawdust around them. The little kids swarm the few tourists, selling a pack of gum for a dollar. I gave one little boy a five-dollar bill for the gum. His face lit up and he ran back to the pack of other boys, triumphantly waving the bill in the air. Then the boys rushed at me with great excitement. It was a small moment of our trip that I won't soon forget.



This makes me think of the many places around the world where people really suffer in their poverty. In the new documentary about St. Mother Theresa, they highlight some of these places – in Africa, South American, New York City, and along our southern border. Mother Teresa's sisters, the Missionaries of Charity, do so much to help the poorest of the poor. They are in over 760 locations, really practicing Gospel charity. And we have it so nice here in our insulated, comfortable lives. I feel the guilt rising in my throat and spilling out of my ears! How soon we forget and blot out those in such great need. I feel ashamed of myself for not doing more for them and for continuing to not appreciate all that I have.

There is an answer to this. We can do something for the poor. We can give. We can be generous with our treasure. We have ample avenues at St. Susanna to give. So, what's holding us back? Give and give a little more. Make sure it costs you when you give. Don't just give the extra you have. Build up your treasure in Heaven!

You can start by purchasing an item or two next weekend at church. They make great Christmas gifts. You will be helping people in Bethlehem eek out of living. You will be helping yourself get to Heaven.

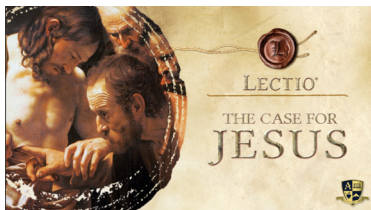

“¿A QUÉ VOCACIÓN EN LA VIDA ME LLAMA DIOS?”

Cada año la Iglesia Católica en Estados Unidos dedica el primer domingo de noviembre a celebrar la Semana Nacional de Concientización Vocacional. Este año, del 6 al 12 de noviembre de 2022, es la celebración anual de una semana dedicada a promover las vocaciones al sacerdocio, diaconado y la vida consagrada a través de la oración, la educación y renovación de nuestro apoyo a quienes están considerando una de estas vocaciones particulares. La Semana Nacional de Concientización Vocacional comenzó en 1976 cuando los obispos católicos de E.U. designaron el domingo 28 de ese año para esta causa. En 1997 se trasladó esta celebración para que coincidiera con la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, que es el 13 de enero. Sin embargo, a partir de 2014 se trasladó el día a la primera semana completa de noviembre de cada año para celebrarlo con las familias y parroquias de todo el país.

Nuestro llamado bautismal es llevar una vida de santidad y amor y cada uno de nosotros lo vive de diferentes maneras, puede ser a través de una vocación que puede implicar la ordenación al sacerdocio, la vida religiosa, matrimonial o soltera o el compromiso con un ministerio particular. Esto significa que Dios nos llama a servirle en diferentes formas que tomamos como nuestras vocaciones. Él nos llama y se dirige a nosotros personalmente y se espera que respondamos con un Sí a través de nuestra fe que mostramos a través del servicio. “Que cada uno lleve la vida que el Señor le ha asignado y a la cual Dios lo ha llamado” (1 Cor. 7:17).

Llegamos a conocer nuestras vocaciones primero de Dios, al reflexionar personalmente sobre nuestras vidas a través de la oración. Uno debe tener algunos momentos de silencio para pensar en su vida y reflexionar sobre lo que puede hacer mejor en su vida para servir a Dios entre Su pueblo. De esta profunda reflexión surge la gente que nos rodea para afirmar el llamado de Dios en nuestras vidas. La voz de Dios puede venir a través de las expresiones de nuestros padres, familiares y amigos, maestros e incluso extraños. Ahí es cuando la gente comienza a preguntarte si alguna vez has considerado ser sacerdote, diácono o hermano(a) religioso(a). Es por eso que durante esta semana están invitados a alentar a su hijo(a), nieto(a), estudiantes, amigos o incluso a su esposo a estar abierto si Dios lo llama al sacerdocio, la vida religiosa o como diácono permanente.

Por tanto, el deber de promover las vocaciones es de todos nosotros a partir de nuestros hogares. Si tenemos padres buenos y comprometidos con su fe, entonces podremos ver un aumento de vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida religiosa. Necesitamos tener familias cristianas fuertes en nuestra nación ancladas en los valores del evangelio. Los padres y los adultos deben ser buenos ejemplos para que lleven a los jóvenes a Dios. La madre descrita en la primera lectura (2 Mc 7:1-2, 9-14) infundió valor a sus siete hijos para que se mantuvieran fuertes en la fe acompañándolos a rechazar las exigencias del rey que iban en contra de sus creencias religiosas. A medida que avanzamos en nuestro camino de fe, debemos mantenernos firmes y animar a nuestros hijos a ofrecer sus vidas mientras toman decisiones difíciles para servirle como sacerdotes y religiosos, así como los siete hermanos dieron sus vidas por la salvación de sus almas. San Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura: “Oren para que la palabra del Señor avance y sea glorificada, como sucedió entre ustedes” (2 Tes 2:16-3:5), no olvidemos siempre rezar la oración por las vocaciones para que los/las jóvenes respondan con un generoso Sí a la difusión de la Palabra de Dios. Sigamos orando por las almas de todos los fieles difuntos para que descansen en paz.

El próximo fin de semana recibiremos a una empresa de Belén en Israel que fabrica y vende artículos religiosos tallados en madera de olivo. Cuando visité Tierra Santa en 2007, tuve la oportunidad de ver trabajar a los artesanos. Belén se encuentra a unas pocas millas al sur de Jerusalén.

Es una zona muy pobre debido al conflicto en curso entre judíos y musulmanes. Las pequeñas tiendas abiertas bordean la calle en Belén con montones de aserrín a su alrededor. Los niños pequeños pululan entre los pocos turistas, vendiendo paquetes de chicles por un dólar. Le di a un niño un billete de cinco dólares por un paquete de chicles. Su rostro se iluminó y corrió hacia los otros niños, agitando triunfalmente el billete en el aire. Entonces los chicos se precipitaron hacia mí con gran emoción. Fue un pequeño momento de nuestro viaje que no olvidaré en mucho tiempo.

Esto me hace pensar en los muchos lugares del mundo donde la gente realmente sufre en su pobreza. En el nuevo documental sobre la Santa Madre Teresa, destacan algunos de estos lugares: en África, América del Sur, la ciudad de Nueva York y a lo largo de nuestra frontera sur. Las hermanas de la Madre Teresa, las Misioneras de la Caridad, hacen mucho para ayudar a los más pobres de los pobres. Están en más de 760 lugares, realmente practicando la caridad del Evangelio. Y nosotros lo tenemos tan bien aquí en nuestras vidas cómodas y aisladas. ¡Siento la culpa subiendo por mi garganta y derramándose por mis oídos! ¡Cuán pronto olvidamos y borramos a los que están tan necesitados! Me avergüenzo de mí mismo por no hacer más por ellos y por seguir sin valorar todo lo que tengo.



Hay una respuesta a esto. Podemos hacer algo por los pobres. Podemos dar. Podemos ser generosos con lo que tenemos. Tenemos muchas opciones en St. Susanna para dar. Entonces, ¿qué nos detiene? Dar y dar un poco más. Asegúrense de que les cueste cuando dan. No se limiten a dar el extra que tienen. ¡Construyan su tesoro en el Cielo!

Pueden comenzar comprando uno o dos artículos el próximo fin de semana en la iglesia. Serían muy buenos regalos de Navidad. Estarían ayudando a las personas en Belén a salir adelante en la vida. Se estarían ayudando a sí mismos a llegar al Cielo.
