She began her professional career as an RN at Fresno Community Hospital in 1969 moving quickly up the administrative ladder serving as a nursing supervisor and manager of the critical care units and emergency room. In addition, she became a Vice-President overseeing the long-term care facilities of the corporation, including the DeWitt Subacute Unit and the education department. In 2003, she was appointed Chief Nurse Executive of the newly opened Fresno Heart Hospital and retired from the hospital environment in 2006.
