

who we are

Divine Mercy is rooted in the Catholic faith, branching out into the Clovis East community with boundaries that extend to Sanger, Shaver Lake and Prather. The parishioners of Divine Mercy are a body of diverse individuals coming together under the guidance of the Holy Spirit to promote the mission of Jesus Christ.

Despite not having a home of our own or a central meeting space, Divine Mercy's parishioners are dedicated to the parish and highly involved in ministry. Divine Mercy has active Catholic Daughters and Knights of Columbus chapters, the Couples for Christ ministry and a vibrant Prayer Group. Faithful parishioners make up the building, capital campaign and liturgy committees, along with the finance and parish councils. We also offer religious education classes, providing formation for both children and adults.

PROJECT #1

WORSHIP CENTER - \$3.8 MILLION

For 13 years, Divine Mercy has been celebrating Mass in the multipurpose room at Clovis East High School. While this has been the site of much community and fellowship and many memorable events, it is time to finally have a home of our own. We plan on building a new worship center on our property that will serve as our church for the foreseeable future. This building will serve our current parishioners and prepare us to accommodate our parish's expected growth.

- Altar, crucifix, sacristy
- Comfortable chairs
- Accessibility for persons of all abilities
- Dedicated space for the choir
- Permanent storage space
- 106 parking spaces
- Ability to have scheduled sacraments
- Increased Mass schedule
- Space for fellowship
- Meeting rooms



NOVEMBER 21, 2010

On the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, Divine Mercy celebrated its first Mass, as a mission church to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, at the Clovis East High school multi-purpose room.

MAY 15, 2016

Under the direction of the Most Rev. Armando X. Ochoa, D.D, Bishop of Fresno, Divine Mercy Catholic Church is established as a parish.

JULY 22, 2013

A 10-acre parcel of land is purchased by the Diocese of Fresno on the corner of Ashlan and Thompson for the future building of Divine Mercy Church.

JUNE 22, 2018

A groundbreaking ceremony for the new parking lot is held on-site with Bishop Ochoa and Fr. Craig Plunket.

PROJECT #2

CLASSROOMS AND OFFICE SPACE - \$1.7 MILLION

Divine Mercy has six portable modular buildings already purchased that will be designed, furnished for functionality and installed in set locations. We currently rent the high school, office space and additional locations throughout the week to accommodate our ministries. Having permanent offices will allow for more convenient office hours and space for ministry meetings. Having our own classrooms will give us the space and freedom for meetings on our schedule. These permanent structures will not only save money, but give us the space we need to grow. expected growth.



 - Gathering space for hospitality after events, coffee and donuts and larger meetings




WHAT IS THE PROJECTED **TIMELINE FOR** THESE PROJECTS?

We hope to begin construction this fall, ideally early to avoid the rainy season. We are making every effort to keep the process moving along each week. The next major step is to get our permits approved from the City of Clovis. As soon as this is accomplished, we will be able to pour concrete and projects will accelerate from there. We are committed to keeping our parishioners informed of all progress that is made and any updates to our timeline.

PROJECT #3

RECTORY - \$500,000

Housing developments are going up across Clovis and adjacent to Divine Mercy's property. We plan to purchase a home in the neighboring community that will become the permanent rectory that is within walking distance, possibly close enough to install a walkway or gate directly leading to the parish. In the future, our parish will grow to support an associate priest or seminarian to meet the spiritual and administrative needs of Divine Mercy. Buying a house will be more affordable than building from scratch, and purchasing something adjacent to our property will allow us to keep the space free on our property for future building.

SEPTEMBER 6, 2020

Fr. Michael Cox is assigned as the pastor of Divine Mercy Catholic Parish.

AUGUST 17, 2023

Site Plan Review submitted to the City of Clovis. Divine Mercy is currently awaiting approval of these plans to receive building permits.

DECEMBER 7, 2022

Six portable buildings are purchased by Divine Mercy to be used for future classrooms and office space.

OCTOBER 8, 2023

The Building Our Home of Spirit and Life Capital Campaign kicks off at Divine Mercy to raise the necessary funds to complete our projects.

CAMPAIGN GOALS AND COSTS

All money raised through previous campaigns and donated to the building fund over the years has been kept in a savings account designated specifically for the building of our new home. Because of the hard work and generous giving of our parishioners over the years, we are already over halfway toward our goal. The *Building Our Home of Spirit and Life* campaign will help us finally close the gap between our savings account and the total amount needed to complete our projects.

WHY NOW

When asked what they love most about Divine Mercy, our people overwhelmingly said the sense of community and friendly environment. Parishioners shared that Divine Mercy feels like a family, and it's only fitting that our family has a permanent home. Our deeply committed community of parishioners desperately longs for adequate and fully accessible space to gather for Mass, fellowship, ministry and faith formation. This is our vision for the *Building Our Home of Spirit and Life* Capital Campaign. Our goal is about more than constructing a new facility; it is about fostering community while building up the faith.

These projects are more than just buildings. They are opportunities. The opportunity to welcome everyone to come and experience the spirit and life of Christ. The opportunity to host gatherings that foster community and fellowship. The opportunity to celebrate weddings and funerals in a sacred space. The opportunity to respond to the rapid growth in our area and welcome new families. The opportunity to include more people in our ministries and formation programs.

Our community has dreamed of a home of our own since Divine Mercy was established 13 years ago. METHODS OF GIVING

There are many options to help meet your needs while supporting Divine Mercy in a meaningful way. Selecting the best gift plan depends on your personal financial situation and goals. You may want to consider stretching pledges over a three-year period to maximize the total amount of support. This commitment can be fulfilled through monthly, quarterly, semiannual or annual installments.

Pledges are commitments made in good faith. Because tax laws change and each situation is unique, donors are encouraged to consult with their financial advisor to determine which method of contributing is most beneficial.

We encourage all donors to consider a 10-20% initial payment to begin your commitment to ensure we can ensure there are no further delays in construction and we are able to see these projects through to their completion.

Cash or Check

Gifts made by cash or check are the most common and will allow Divine Mercy to address its immediate needs. Checks should be made payable to Divine Mercy with "capital campaign" in the memo.

Online Giving

Gifts of stocks, bonds or mutual funds are encouraged when supporters have the desire to make a charitable gift and avoid capital gains tax. Direct Qualified Charitable Distribution from a Retirement Account

Benefactors can make charitable gifts using funds from tax-deferred individual retirement accounts (IRAs). Donors may use this strategy to satisfy part, or all, of their required minimum distribution and lower overall tax liability to benefit Divine Mercy.

Planned Gifts

Planned gifts provide opportunities to make a meaningful commitment to the campaign now as part of your financial and estate planning. Such gifts can allow donors to accomplish charitable giving goals and take advantage of tax laws. Opportunities may include:
