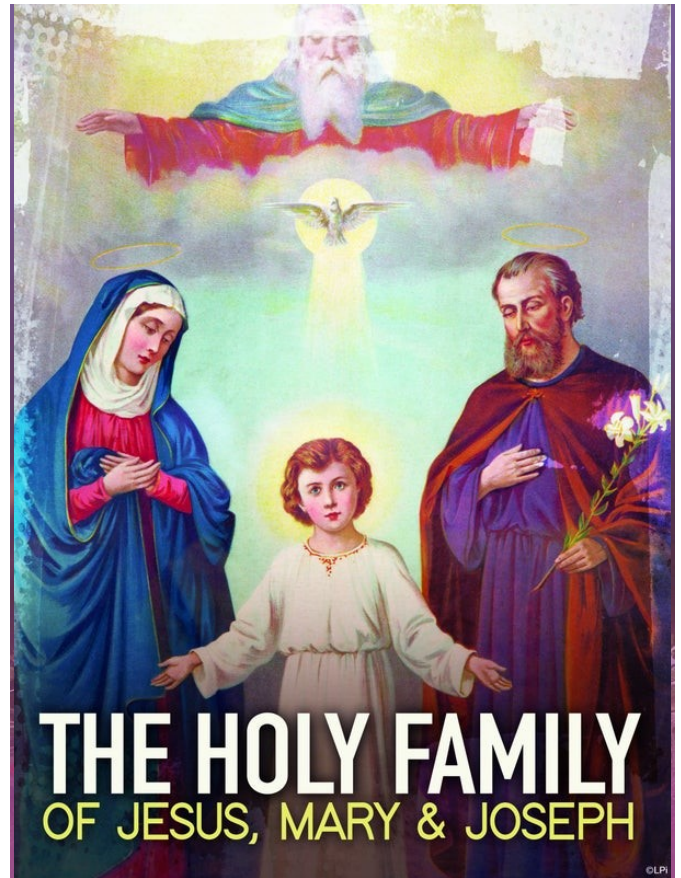

Holy Family – the Perfect Model for Each Family

Traditionally, the Sunday within the octave of Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Family. This feast offers us an opportunity to reflect on the nature and importance of family life for us all. As the basic unit of society, the family gives life, nurturance and support throughout our journey. Today's readings provide us with a very clear message that underlies this feast: Believe in Jesus and love one another. How do we express our faith in Jesus as a family? One of the best ways to do that is to worship on Sunday as a family. Even if that involves some sacrifice, what a beautiful way to express our faith – to attend mass, to help out any way we can, to listen to the readings together, to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus together, and hopefully to share what that experience was for us afterwards as a family. Another way that families can pray together is to read the bible and study it together. That is perhaps more challenging, and unfortunately rarely done, but what better way to grow in faith than to listen to and study God's word together as a family? The second part is to love one another. We can only imagine what the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph was like – how great was their love for one another. That love is shown through the great anxiety they felt until they found Jesus in the Temple being about his Father's business. We are called to model our family life after the Holy Family. May our celebration of Holy family strengthen our family life, and help us to live out the message of this feast, to truly believe in Jesus and to love one another from the heart.

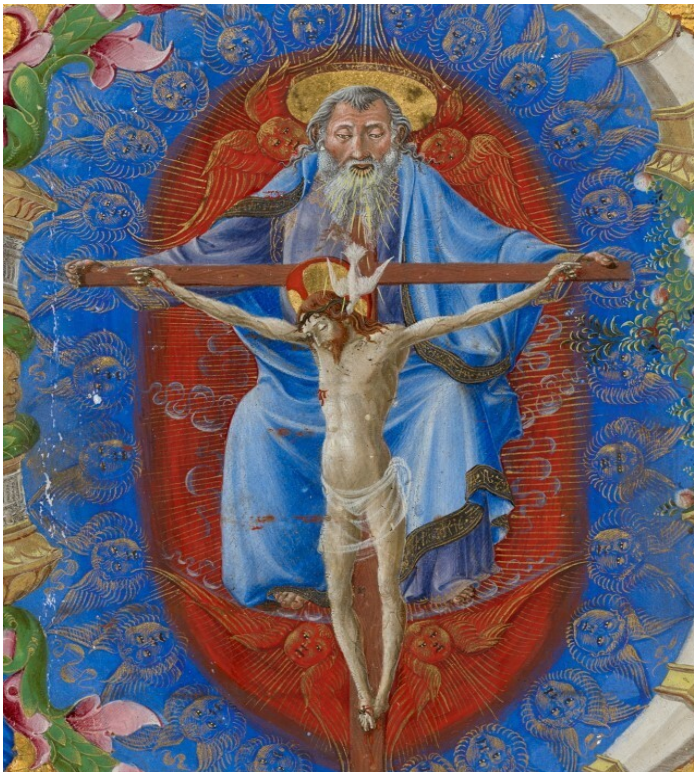

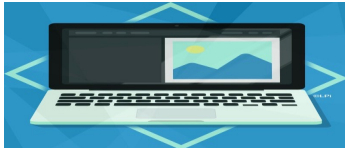
Please note: The church office will be closed December 27th and 31st.

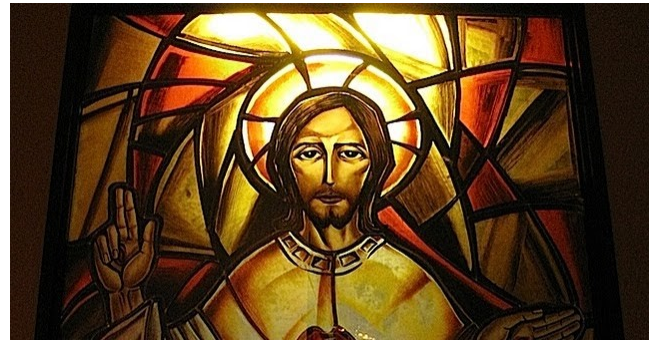
Our new website is up and ready!

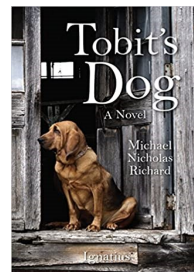
