- Dress Code, Sixth through Eighth grade:
 - o All: white or red polo shirt, tucked in.

 Spirit wear sweatshirts are allowed only on Thursdays.
 - 6th-8th girls: Wilson skort or skirt.
 - All: shoes must be closed toe and have a back. Boots are not allowed.

Detention Policy for Junior High

- Students with outstanding assignments or unacceptable behavior must attend after school detention from 3:05-3:25 on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in the 8th grade classroom.
- Students will complete a detention form which will notify parents via email that their child has been issued a detention.
- After 12 PM, students will complete the detention form AND make a phone call home
- Detentions will be served on the day detention is issued.
- Students are to be picked up at the front steps of school at 3:25.
- The students will use this time to complete missing work or reflect on behavior.
- Repeated behavior detentions will result in large consequences and conferences with the junior high team.



SOS Hours:

- Families must complete 15 service hours by May.
- All volunteers must have their Safe Environment information and fingerprints up to date and on file with the office.
- Younger siblings are not allowed to be on campus when volunteering.



Drop Off and Pick Up:

- Please remain in your vehicle. When dropping off, have your child ready to exit the vehicle. Do not get out of your vehicle.
- When picking up, please have a sign with your family name in your windshield.
- Please do not block the street on Pleasant Avenue while waiting to enter the loading zone. Do not enter loading zone for pick up earlier than 15 minutes before dismissal.
- Do not create a backup on Church Street while waiting to enter the alley. The gate will open 10 minutes before dismissal.



Birthdays:

- Students may wear free dress any day but Wednesday.
- Treats must be pre arranged with the teacher and should be single served. Parents must drop these off in the office or classroom before school.
- Individual gifts should not be brought to school.


