John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." (Jn 1:29)

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Lamb of God

John the Baptist introduced Jesus to the Jews as the "Lamb of God" on the second day (Jn 1:29). He repeats it on the third day. "Lamb of God" is the most meaningful title given to Jesus in the Bible. It has been used 29 times in the book of Revelation. It sums up the love, the sacrifice, and the triumph of Christ. John the Baptist was a symbol of simplicity. His role was to prepare the way for Jesus. He did it in a more impressive way. The reward he got for it was to present his head to Herod the king.

The world is like that. One who works for the upliftment of society or to bring change in society will have to face threats from others. The consequence of that is the destruction of goodness. There is always somebody to prepare the way and reform society, but society will wipe him out slowly. There is a saint in the Eastern Church, St. Kuriakose Chavara, a religious priest from Kerala, India who dedicated his life for the renewal of the poor. He started many schools combined with parish Churches. If there is a Church, there will be a school too. That is the idea. It was successful. The outcome of it was tremendous. Poor people could get free and quality education. St. Kuriakose was marked as the reformer of the society. Many were inspired by him. Today the state Kerala is first in education. But unfortunately, the Government of Kerala removed the chapter that narrated the life of St. Kuriakose from the textbook of social studies. The life of John the Baptist reflects here. The people who prepare way for others are forgotten soon. History can be deleted, the image can be destroyed by Herods, but the sacrifice is ever remembered.

Our traditional fraction anthem is the *Agnus Dei* – "Lamb of God, who take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us/grant us peace." In this prayer we give expression to our deepest understanding of the identity and purpose of Jesus Christ as our Lamb and Lord. By His life of love and sacrifice, we believe and affirm that He is the One Who was to come, came, and continues to come, into a broken world to take our sins upon Himself.


