- * Each parish will decide their definition of active participation in youth ministry; however, the expectation is that these teens are members of an Ordinariate parish and active in the youth ministry program of that parish to the degree that such a program exists.
- ** This is a teen retreat, and topics addressed will be geared to the teen experience and level of maturity; thus, no one under the age of 14 (entering Freshmen) will be allowed to attend. On the other end, teens who will have just graduated in the class of 2024 and have turned 18 during the academic year, will be allowed to attend; however, they will have to have completed the Ordinariate's Safe Environment Training online course and will be bunked with other 18 year olds or the adults as needed.

Texas Ordinariate Youth Retreat ~ Guidelines ~

Attire Guidelines

• If your retreatant is packing their own clothes, please help them understand the camp attire and swimwear guidelines and maybe do a once over of the clothes they've packed to make sure they fit the camp attire and swimwear guidelines!

General Camp Attire

o All clothing must fit appropriately. It should not be tight or revealing.

- Shorts (both men and women), skirts, and dresses must come to the top of the knee or below.
 - If a female retreatant chooses to wear a skirt or dress, modesty shorts must also be worn.
- O Shirts must have sleeves of some type (the ½ sleeves are acceptable but sleeveless is not, this includes but is not limited to tank tops and muscle shirts). Sleeves may not have gaping holes or cut-outs.

o All girls are to wear bras, and we should never see any part of them.

 Leggings/yoga pants are not acceptable unless a loose-fitting top is also worn of midthigh or longer length

No open midriffs

O All clothing must be in accordance with Christian values. No worldly or sexual references or innuendos.

Swimwear

 All Campers must be fully covered to and from swimming areas (shorts, t-shirts, coverups, shoes/sandals, etc.).

Boys must wear swim trunks or board shorts that reach the top of the knee. Speedos
are not allowed. They may wear a dark colored t-shirt as well.

 Girls must wear a modest (full-coverage, no cut-outs or low necklines), athletic-type one piece swimsuit with shorts. They may wear a dark colored t-shirt as well.

Swimsuits that are deemed too revealing (male or female) will be covered by board shorts and a dark colored t-shirt – we will have extras for those who do not come prepared.

 Please pack for two extra sets of clothes to get wet or dirty during recreation. Girls should also bring several dark shirts for recreation. Recreation will frequently involve water, and shirts that can be seen through when wet are not acceptable.

THE RETREAT CHAPERONES MAY REQUIRE ANY CAMPER TO CHANGE CLOTHES, OR WEAR PROVIDED COVERINGS IF THE RETREATANT'S CLOTHING IS DEEMED INAPPROPRIATE. ALL SUCH DETERMINATIONS WILL BE MADE BY AN AGREEMENT OF AT LEAST TWO (2) RETREAT CHAPERONES.

Behavior Guidelines

General Behavior

We are to please the Lord at all times and in all places.


 Retreatants are to demonstrate Christian Character and adhere to the Ordinariate Youth Code of Behaviour, which they have signed with their own hand.

- Retreatants are to be respectful of the retreat staff, priests, seminarians, parent chaperones, and camp staff and adhere to their instructions without quibbling.
- o Retreatants are to attend all services, meals, and all scheduled activities.
- The waterfront and its activities are off limits except at designated times with counselors and lifeguards present.
- If you have a problem with a fellow retreatant, and you feel it is necessary to tell someone, tell it to your own parish's lead chaperone and the retreat director only, do not discuss it with others.
- o Campers are expected to sleep in their assigned cabins and remain in their cabins after "lights out" each night.
- The destruction of property or wildlife will not be permitted. Writing on or otherwise defacing bunks, tables, or other camp property is not allowed.

What we ask you to leave at home

- No cell phones, music players, or electronic devices while on retreat. Leave them all at home. Chaperones will have their cell phones for the purpose of alarms and to allow youth to briefly call home if deemed necessary. Should a retreatant be found in possession of an electronic device, it will be taken up and held by the parish's lead chaperone until the end of the retreat, and returned upon arrival back at the retreatant's home parish.
- No Illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products (including vaping)
- o No weapons, or anything that resembles such; this includes, but is not limited to firearms, fixed-blade knives, hatchets, fireworks, nunchuks, etc. (if you have to ask if it's okay to bring, then best to leave it at home).
- No clothing with profanity, sexuality, drugs, alcohol, anything contrary to church teaching or human decency.

THE DIRECTORS RESERVE THE RIGHT TO SEND ANY PERSON HOME IF, IN THEIR JUDGMENT, SUCH ACTION IS WARRANTED BY THE ACTIONS, COMMENTS, OR DEMEANOR OF SAID PERSON, AND WILL FUNCTION TO THE ONGOING SUCCESS OF THE RETREAT. UNDER SUCH CIRCUMSTANCES, NO REFUND WILL BE MADE.





YOUTH CODE OF BEHAVIOR

(Adaptable by parishes, communities, and schools only with permission of the Director of Child and Youth Protection.)

Welcome to the Youth Ministry/Educational programs of the Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter. We expect you will represent your parish, educational program, or school and the Ordinariate well during all programs and gatherings. Remember that you are a witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all who will attend; demonstrate Christian consideration, sensitivity, and respect to everyone and to the property around you. We are confident you will display the maturity, responsible leadership, and character, which have become the trademark qualities of Catholic youth. Thank You.

In General

Youth Ministry/Educational Leaders are responsible for the behavior of the members of their group. Leaders and adult chaperones are to help enforce this Code of Behavior and to set an example for their youth. Leaders and chaperones have been given the authority to reprimand those in violation. These persons will be made known to you in advance. Please give them your respect and cooperation.

Some Rules

- 1. Remember that disruptive behavior can result in serious injury to persons and/or property, and you could be asked to leave the activity for such behavior. Each participant is legally and financially responsible for the removal, defacing, or willful damage to public or private property.
- 2. Participants must attend all scheduled activities and may not leave early without prior written approval of a parent or guardian.
- 3. At overnight events, socializing prior to curfew should be done in the public areas. Remember to keep noise levels down in the sleeping areas; especially later in the evenings. This guarantees the right to privacy and quiet times for other overnight attendees and other guests. All participants must be in their assigned rooms or areas by curfew. No visiting is permitted in areas occupied by members of the opposite sex.
- 4. Be on time for scheduled activities. When exiting the building, parish, prayer, Mass, and other activities, please keep noise to a minimum so that other activities still in session will not be disturbed.
- 5. Smoking is not permitted at youth activities.
- 6. Participants may not possess weapons of any kind.
- 7. Cell phones are to be turned off during general sessions, workshops, at prayer, and liturgy. Please keep calls to a minimum at all other times. Texting during workshops, liturgy, or general sessions is also not appropriate.
- 8. Youth should dress modestly and appropriately. Your body is God's sacred creation. Respect it as a gift from God. The way you dress is a reflection of what you are on the inside. Show yourself to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.
- 9. Youth are not to hurt anyone verbally, emotionally, physically, or sexually. Treat everyone with respect, patience, integrity, courtesy, dignity, and consideration.
- 10. Youth are to report any emergencies, concerns, strangers or intruders, and safety issues immediately to adult leaders or chaperones.


