Baptism: Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class before Baptism and it is recommended in advance of the child's birth. Contact the Parish Office.


<u>Marriage</u>: Couples should contact the Parish Office at least a year before the date of the wedding and before any other plans are made.

COVERING STATUES AND CROSSES IN CHURCH

The tradition of covering statues and crosses likely has its roots in the medieval usage of a veil to cover the entire Sanctuary during the Lenten Season. The Fifth Sunday of Lent traditionally brings the Church into the time of Passiontide'wherein the intensity of our preparation for the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection is increased. To cover the statues deprives the visual senses of the joy of seeing the fruit of the Paschal Mystery exemplified in the Saints. It likewise forces the mind and the heart to focus more intently on the central acts of Christ's redeeming work of love. (Stained glass windows, Stations of the Cross and the Processional Cross remain uncovered.) The covering of the statues remain in place until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, and then uncovered for the glorious Easter Vigil Liturgy on the Holiest of All Nights!


