This **Sunday, November 29, 2020**, rings in the New Year of the Church. In this new year, again we want to follow Christ from the announcement of his birth through his passion, death and resurrection and experience more deeply everything about Christ in between and beyond. **St. Mark** is the Evangelist who will accompany us on our journey this year as he shares with us, through his Gospel account, the many aspects of the life and mission of Jesus Christ on this earth. The new year of the Church begins with the season of Advent. **This Sunday, November 29, is the First Sunday of Advent.**

The word Advent means “coming” or “arrival”. Advent is observed over these next four Sundays leading to Christmas. The focus of this entire season is preparation for the coming of Christ. As we draw closer to Christmas, Advent will remind us of the extraordinary gift that the birth of Jesus Christ is for the world. More importantly, however, in its first part, Advent will remind us that we are a people in constant waiting and anticipation for the return of Christ. Advent is far more than simply marking a 2,000-year-old event in history. It is the recognition of the truth that Christ will come again in all his glory at the end of time. It is written in the *Acts of the Apostles* that, as Jesus ascended into heaven, two men dressed in white approached the disciples who were gazing up after Jesus. The two men said, “*Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven*” (*Acts 1:11*). We, as Christians, live with the expectation that Jesus will return to us in all his glory and will bring about the fulfillment of the Father’s Kingdom. Exactly when this will happen is not for us to know.

Weary of the Covid virus; weary after a season of vicious campaigning; weary after so much battling among the political parties; weary from so much fighting and protesting, we need this season of Advent very much. Advent gives us hope. And even though that hope may seem faint at times, and that God himself may sometimes seem distant, Advent brings us hope in a Savior who brings the remedy of truth, righteousness, justice and love into a world that has corrupted itself in so many ways.

The announcement of the Governor’s three week pause last Sunday, while not a surprise, has certainly given cause for dissatisfaction, especially as we have just traditionally begun a season on Thanksgiving Day that, as the song says, is supposed to be “the most wonderful time of the year”. We have certainly been left to wonder if it is going to be that this year.

As you know, Fr. Julian and I tested positive for the Covid virus. We, along with the entire parish staff, were put on a 14-day period of quarantine. Fr. Julian and I were very fortunate, as we experienced little to no symptoms during our quarantine. In fact, I have had colds with symptoms that were much worse. That being said, I know that there are other people who have not been quite as fortunate. This virus seems to affect people in many different ways. Each one of us has to do our part to make sure that we keep ourselves healthy as well as those around us.

Being mostly asymptomatic, as I was, it can be easy to forget that, even though you might feel well, there still could be the possibility of transferring the virus to others. That is why we need to be careful. Wearing masks, washing hands, and keeping socially distant, especially when casually coming into contact with others, whether here at church, or wherever we may be, is probably the best method of protection for ourselves and for the people we meet. So, please remember these precautions.

Fr. Julian and I are grateful that we have gotten through this virus as well as we did. We thank all of the parishioners who showed their concern for us through prayers and dropping off “supplies”. Your kindness is greatly appreciated. We offer our prayers for all who have been touched by this virus and are continuing to deal with its effects. May the grace of God be upon you all and grant you strength and healing. May you all be filled with the many blessings this Advent season brings!

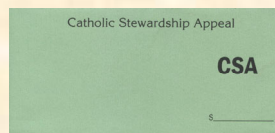

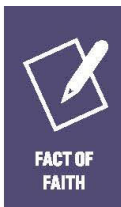

The Advent Wreath

About Advent Wreaths

Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of ever-green branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose, but white candles can also be used.

The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath

The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent.



When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.
Response (R/.) Who made heaven and earth.

Then the Scripture, Isaiah 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) is read:

Reader: The Word of the Lord.
R/. Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God,
we praise you for your Son,
Jesus Christ:
he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,

he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,
he is the Savior of every nation.
Lord God,
let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath.
May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.
May he come quickly and not delay.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
R/. Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations,
bind in one the hearts of humankind;
bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

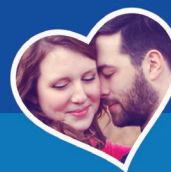

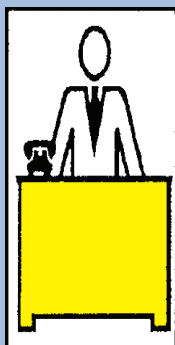

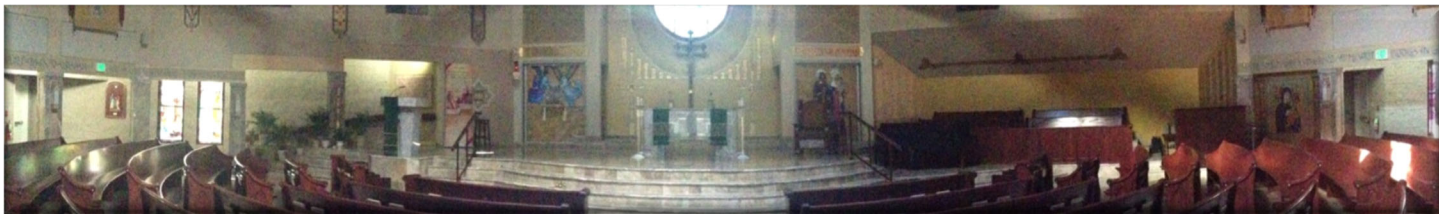
