## **Reflections From the Pastor**



### **Corpus Christi Sunday**

This Sunday the Church celebrates the Feast of Corpus Christi. This feast has special meaning for me because it is through receiving the Eucharist "by accident" at a high school retreat that I joined the Catholic Church because I felt the power of God enter my body like I never had before. It is through spending time in Eucharistic adoration that I heard the call to be a priest. The first Mass I celebrated as a priest was on this feast of Corpus Christi in 2002. Celebrating the Eucharist daily is my greatest joy!

The connections between the Old Testament and New Testament are amazing! On the Day of Atonement, or Yom Kippur, a priest entered the Holy of Holies, the most sacred place of the temple, with a goat and a bullock. They sacrificed the bullock and sprinkled its blood on the people and on the goat. They placed their sins upon the goat and sent it out to die in atonement for the sins of the people. This became known as the scapegoat.

The feast of Passover commemorates the Jews' escape from Egypt. On this day, they sacrificed an unblemished lamb, ate the meat and sprinkled the blood on the doorpost so that the angel of death would pass over their house.

This background is important because the night before the feast of Passover, Jesus had his last supper with His disciples. He took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to them saying, "Take it; this is my body." Then He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." The next day, Jesus offered His body as a sacrifice for all of us to seal the covenant of love with us. This sacrifice would never have to be repeated. At Mass, we remember this sacrifice and make it present; we do not re-sacrifice Jesus.

When Jesus was teaching about the Eucharist in the synagogue in Capernaum (John 6), many of His followers left. They thought He was talking about cannibalism and they all left except the Twelve. Jesus didn't call them back by saying, "I'm just kidding. I didn't mean that literally. I was only speaking metaphorically." He let them walk away, and He looked at the Twelve remaining and asked, "Will you leave me too?" In other words, "I know this is hard to understand, but do you trust me?" Peter spoke up and said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You alone have the words of everlasting life."


Jesus entrusted the ministry of priesthood to His apostles and their successors. In the Gospel today, Jesus tells His apostles, "Give them some food yourselves." Priests around the world continue to feed the people of God through the Eucharist – the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.
