## **Elements of the Eucharistic Revival Year at St. Rose:**

Eucharistic Miracle Posters- Likely the first thing you will notice in the Church. Not just a symbol, the Eucharist is the very presence of Christ in power. Blessed Carlo Acutis, who died at age 15 in 2006 knew this. He spent a significant portion of his short life collecting information from around the world on the miracles that have occurred. Most of these miracles highlight the nature of the Eucharist itself. As you read these miracles, ponder how generous God has been in giving us the gift of His presence throughout all time.

Eucharistic Processions: The Church holds Eucharistic Processions to allow the world to see, in a very concrete and visible manner, the presence of Christ in the world. These processions present a two-fold direction. We see Christ, and we are blessed by His presence. The Corpus Christi procession, will launch the year of Eucharistic revival. Then, in the fall, we will join other local Catholic parishes in a pilgrimage to the cross on Mt. McCoy.





Opportunities for Renewed Faith Encounters: Jesus said "I make all things new." (Rev 21:5). All of us, need Jesus breathed into to us anew. Even the greatest saints, knowing their need for more of Christ, sought out retreats and times of prayer to renew their faith. We hope every member of the parish can attend at least one of the opportunities that will be provided. Look for more information soon.

**Eucharistic Movie Nights:** These will include theatrical releases partnered with content from Bishop Baron on the nature of the Eucharist.

Fellowship Nights: C.S.Lewis said, in his short essay entitled 'The Weight of Glory'-- "besides the Eucharist, the Holiest thing you will ever encounter in this life is the person next to you. If you were able to see them as they truly are, you would be tempted to fall down (in awe)" Christian fellowship, simply getting to know one another more, was one of the main four avenues that the early Church outlined as key to growing closer to God. We do not walk the spiritual journey alone.
