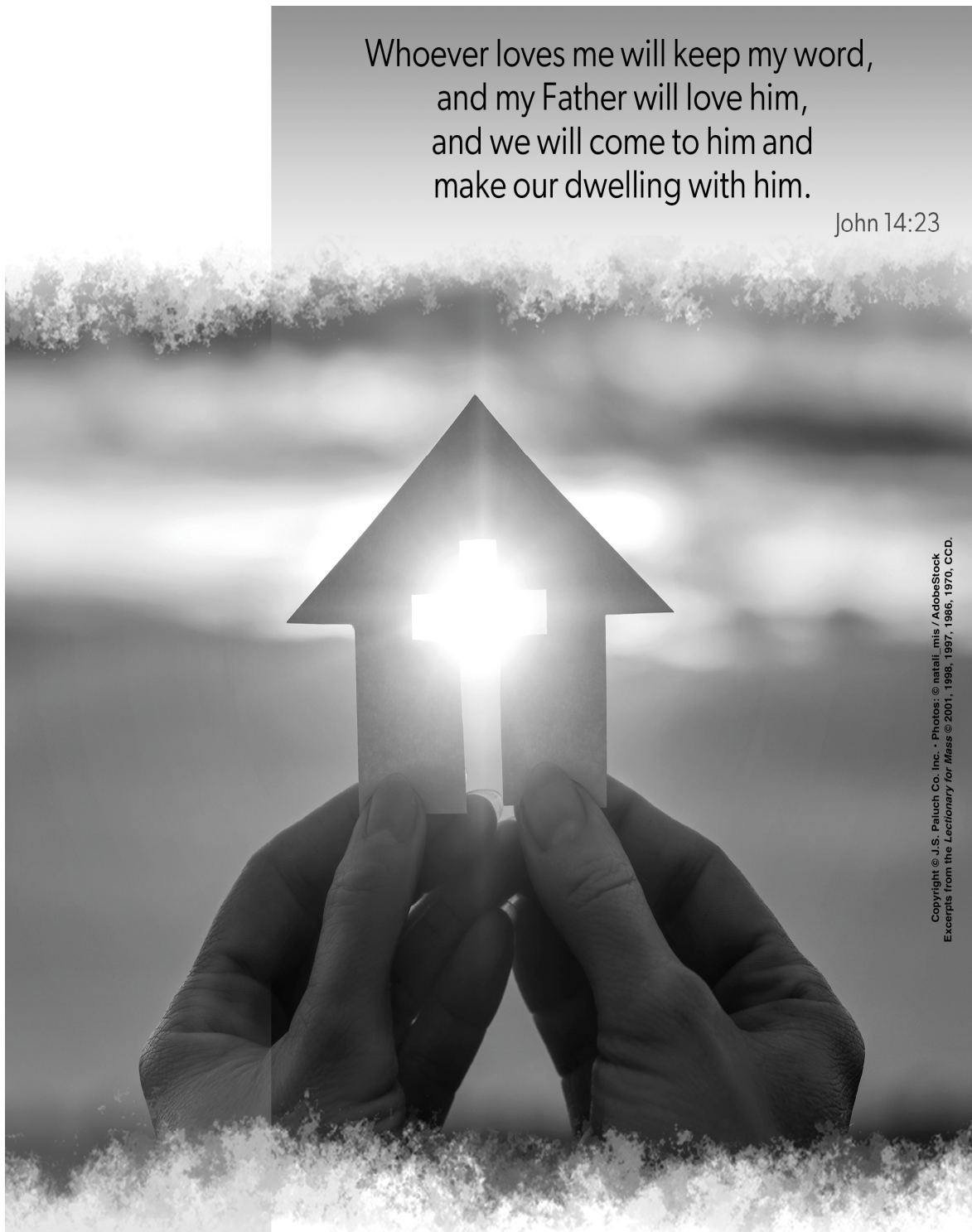

remembering dr. rance thomas **from father mike**
celebrating the common good may 22nd, 2022



Late last week we received the news of the death long-time North County community leader for social justice, **Dr. Rance Thomas**. He was a 20 year veteran of the United States Air Force and served during the Vietnam conflict. After service in the military he became a professor, author, and visionary leader with degrees from the University of Nebraska, Southern

Illinois University, and St. Louis University. His wisdom, knowledge, and understanding were gifts he generously and humbly shared with many.

Dr. Thomas's vision and selfless devotion to his community led him to cofound **North County Churches Uniting for Racial Harmony and Justice** in 1998. Especially through this coalition of more than 20 churches, I found him to be a man whose spirit and energy well fulfills what Pope John XXIII had in mind when he spoke to the bishops of our Church called together for the 2nd Vatican Council:

*“Consult not your fears, but **your hopes and dreams**.
Think not about your frustrations, but
about **your unfulfilled potential**.
Concern yourself not with what you tried and failed in,
but with what it is **still possible for you to do**.”*

*St. Angelo Roncalli, Pope John XXIII, October 1962,
Opening Address of the 2nd Vatican Council*

Throughout his lifetime Dr. Thomas received much recognition and numerous awards. However, his greatest **award and achievement**—that he would have told anyone that asked—was simply **being a good neighbor and friend to the many great people that live, work, and protect the North St. Louis County community**.

In November 2013, on the recommendation of our Parish Pastoral Council, our parish became a Covenant Church of NCCU. As a faith community we made the commitment to each other and to each member parish and congregation that we would —

***Become better informed** about people
of other races and cultures that we may overcome
the fears and misconceptions that exist*

***Consider how issues** of racial prejudice and privilege
affect each person we come in contact with*

***Work to overcome** the structures of our communities
which are racist*

***Work to erase** the sins of racism and injustice wherever
they exist in our communities, and*

***Prayerfully heed God's call** to embrace people
of all colors, faiths, economic and social backgrounds
as our brothers and sisters*

Please join me in prayerfully honoring the life of this good man and community leader. Certainly our greatest joy and achievement might also be in our simply **“being a good neighbor and friend”** to many. I think that would make him very happy and surely now must be the foundation of his peace in Christ which will always be a blessing on us.

Parish Telephone Campaign

In 2015 our parish held a parish telephone campaign which acknowledged active members, encouraged inactive members, and gathered information concerning needs and census data. That campaign was a success and reached 447 of our 572 households.

That was 7 years ago, and we know with COVID, with the changing demographics of our area, and changes in our parish family, our records are not up to date.

Due to the changes we have experienced, Father Mike has asked us to do another parish census telephone campaign.

The phone calls will take place over the next couple of months and will take only a few minutes. The information you provide will be invaluable to our parish as we plan for the future and the presence of the Catholic Church in our community

Monthly Candlelight Community Peace/Social Justice Vigil

Our monthly candlelight community peace/social justice vigils are held outdoors on the front steps of our church on the last Sunday of each month. Our next vigil will be held on May 29 at 7 pm. In case of inclement weather, we will gather in the Church vestibule. This monthly vigil is sponsored by the Holy Name of Jesus Social Justice group, Justice Grows, and lasts 30 minutes. 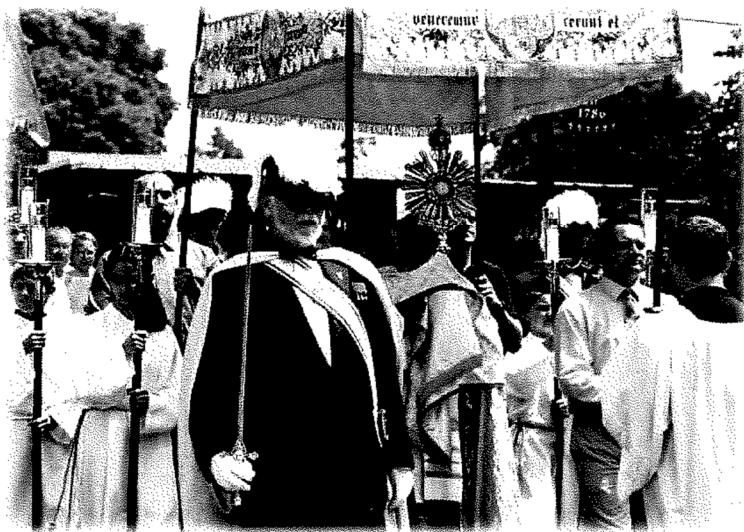
