Several weeks ago 5 members of our Evangelization Team and Deacon George attended the SEEK23 conference at the America Center. 17,000 Catholics of all ages from across the country gathered to learn the tools of **Evangelization**. 300 colleges and 900 parishes were represented. The conference called us to live our faith joyously and to evangelize to all through accompaniment, testimony and prayer. There was a track at the conference specifically for "Making Missionary Disciples". This track gave us practical ways to witness to the Gospel in our family, parish and broader community.

At our January meeting the members of our Evangelization Team did goal setting for 2023. We will publish our goals as soon as we have finalized them. If you have any goals you would like to suggest, please contact Sister Mary or any member of our Evangelization Team.

World Marriage Day

On **Sunday, February 12, 2023, at 12:30 pm.**, Auxiliary Bishop Mark S. Rivotuso will celebrate a Mass for World Marriage Day at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, 4431 Lindell Blvd. St. Louis, MO. A reception will follow in Boland Hall. All married couples are invited to attend and celebrate the gift of marriage. World Marriage Day honors husband and wife as the foundation of the family – the basic unit of society. It emphasizes the faithfulness, sacrifice and joy of daily married life. World Marriage Day started in Baton Rouge, LA in 1981 and was later adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter who now is sponsoring this event on February 12th.

Holy Name's Spiritual Reading Library

Please sign out the book you would like to read and keep it as long as you wish. Place the sign-out card in the basket on the shelf in the bookcase. Spiritual reading is a practice of reading books and articles about spirituality with the purpose of growing in faith and your relationship with God. Studies have shown that reading books on spirituality improves your mental and physical health and helps you feel less stressed. It is a way to hear God speaking to you.

Our monthly candlelight community peace/social justice vigils are held outdoors on the front steps of our church on the last Sunday of each month. Our next vigil will be held on January 29, at 7 pm.
