## Camp Directors



-Bobby Steinburg, Head Coach, CHS Varsity Boy's Basketball. Known for his ability to teach and develop talent, former college coach, Bobby Steinburg came to Catholic High School in the summer of 2020. He wasted no time in leading the Crusaders in the right direction. In his first season, Steinburg navigated through the pandemic to guide CHS to a runner-up finish in the VISSA Div. 1 state tournament. With an abbreviated season under his belt, the 2021-22 Crusaders posted a 25-7 record (most wins/best record in CHS modern history), capturing the TCIS regular season crown and reaching the state quarterfinals where they lost a buzzer beater to Paul VI, who finished their season ranked in the NATIONAL Top 5. Under Steinburg's guidance, Catholic had a record setting season in 2022-23, as they finished the TCIS undefeated as regular season AND tournament champions and completed VISAA catholic with a 34 record top 5 state. they finished the TCIS undefeated as regular season AND tournament champions and completed VISAA state play with a 34-3 record, top 5 state ranking, a Final 4 appearance in state playoffs, and an invitation to a national tournament. CHS set a school record for wins (34), single season winning % (.850), and a school, TCIS, and VISAA 1 record with a 30-game win-streak. In 2023-24, the Crusaders finished the season at 25-9 and a state quarterfinal finish. The 2024-25 campaign finished with a 23-9 record a TCIS regular season and quarterfinal finish. The 2024-25 campaign finished with a 23-9 record, a TCIS regular season and tournament championship and a state tournament birth. Prior to joining the HS ranks, Steinburg enjoyed a 24-year college coaching career where he served as a head, associate head, and assistant coach during his time. Spending the majority of his career at the NCAA Division I level, his career included time at Kent State, Middle Tenn., Univ. of Idaho, Youngstown St., Bellarmine Univ., Univ. of California-Davis, and Motlow St. Steinburg's career boasted NCAA and NIT tournaments, conference regular season and tournament championships, and he has been ranked by national publications in a variety of coaching categories. Crediting all successes to the hard work and character of the student-athletes, he also played vital roles in the development of over 60 players who went on to play development of over 60 players who went on to play professionally and coached and recruited 66 all-conference selections.



-Greg Lusk, Associate Head Coach, Varsity Boy's Basketball /Head Coach, Team Loaded 757. One of the sharpest young coaches in high school basketball, the 2010 Penn State graduate is a true student of the game. "You'll be hard pressed to find a time of day (or month or year) that Greg Lusk isn't coaching, breaking down film, meeting with student-athletes, or a bevvy of other basketball related tasks," Steinburg says. A basketball strategist, Lusk has spent 17 years coaching middle or high school with his last 13 as a varsity assistant and 5 of those years as an ubersuccessful JV head coach. His young career has made stops in PA, TN, and VA. Lusk has coached AAU basketball for the last 15 years, has been at CHS since 2014, and has played an integral role in the Crusaders' recent resurgence.
