

Pastor's Note...

Why go to Church?

A Church goer wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper and complained that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday.

He wrote: "I've gone for 30 years now, and in that time I have heard something like 3,000 sermons, but for the life of me, I can't remember a single one of them. So, I think I'm wasting my time, the preachers and priests are wasting theirs by giving sermons at all".

This started a real controversy in the "Letters to the Editor" column. Much to the delight of the editor, it went on for weeks until someone wrote this clincher:

"I've been married for 30 years now. In that time my wife has cooked some 32,000 meals. But, for the life of me, I cannot recall the entire menu for a single one of those meals.

But I do know this: They all nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work. If my wife had not given me these meals, I would be physically dead today.

Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today!"

¿Por qué ir a la Iglesia?

Un asistente a la Iglesia escribió una carta al editor de un periódico y se quejó de que no tenía sentido ir a la iglesia todos los domingos.

Escribió: "He ido durante 30 años, y en ese tiempo he escuchado algo así como 3.000 sermones, pero por la vida de mí, no puedo recordar ni uno solo de ellos. Entonces, creo que estoy perdiendo el tiempo, los predicadores y sacerdotes están desperdiciando el suvo dando sermones".

Esto inició una verdadera controversia en la columna "Cartas al editor". Para deleite del editor, se prolongó durante semanas hasta que alguien escribió este clincher:

"Llevo 30 años casada. En ese tiempo mi esposa ha cocinado unas 32.000 comidas. Pero, por la vida de mí, no puedo recordar todo el menú de una sola de esas comidas.

Pero sí sé esto: todos me nutrieron y me dieron la fuerza que necesitaba para hacer mi trabajo. Si mi esposa no me hubiera dado estas comidas, hoy estaría físicamente muerto.

Del mismo modo, si no hubiera ido a la iglesia en busca de alimento, ¡estaría espiritualmente muerto hoy!"

Ladies of Charity


Volunteers are needed for 2 important ministries:


