

LIGHTS OF HOPE

ST. TERESA OF AVILA

WHEN: 1515 - 1582 WHERE: AVILA. SPAIN



Since her birth in 1515, Teresa led an ordinary life until she was a teenager. When she was 16, Teresa cared only about boys, clothes, and being a rebel. Disappointed, Teresa's father sent her to the local Carmelite convent. After some time, Teresa began to enjoy being there and would eventually choose to stay.

Once permanently placed into the community, Teresa would face many difficulties within the convent. The most significant one being that she gave up prayer until the age of 41, when a priest convinced her to go back to prayer. Returning to prayer was not easy for Teresa, yet later she would use these experiences within her future writings to describe mental prayer, the struggles within it, and how to discern the movements of the heart. In time, the Lord began to give consolation and spiritual delights to Teresa within prayer.

From 43 to her death at 67 years old, Teresa spent the rest of her life founding a new convent that went back to the basics of contemplative order: a simple life of poverty, devoted to prayer. In 1970, she was declared a Doctor of the Church for her writings and teaching on prayer.
