

### A Reflection of the Gospel from Living Liturgy

2017: This Sunday's gospel is the source for the familiar adage, "practice what you preach." Over the centuries since Matthew's gospel recorded these words of Jesus who is berating the scribes and Pharisees because "they preach but they do not practice." other savings have crept into our language usage that address the same issue. For example, we might recall the words attributed to St. Frances of Assisi, preach the gospel but use words only when needed. Like the scribes and Pharisees we too sometimes say things but do the opposite. The real issue here is integrity. Honesty in living and relating to others means that our whole selves—words and actions, body and soul-are united by hearts turned toward God.

This gospel is saying that turning our hearts toward God who is to be central in our lives is a matter of doing works out of love for God and others, and acting with the integrity of Jesus. Our words and deeds—our word-behaviors—must reveal our ultimate word-behavior: that we are disciples of Jesus, the servant of others. This means that we never forget our first and most important title, which is not to be teacher or master, but to be humble servant. This means that we practice what we preach. And what we preach is Jesus, who is humble servant now exalted.
