



Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion April 13, 2025

In this reading of our Lord's Passion we hear of Jesus' Last Supper, betrayal by Judas, trial both before the Sanhedrin and Pilate, suffering, crucifixion, death, and burial. Various details are embedded in this account of our Lord's final hours of earthly ministry and each of these details is telling us something about the deeper meaning of what is happening. Each passion narrative is profoundly rich in meaning and helps us enter more deeply into the mystery of the crucified Lord. You are encouraged to take time this week and carefully read the Passion Narrative in its entirety so as to enter into these Holy Days with Jesus as He leads us to His glorious resurrection.

Note how Jesus takes time to accomplish some of His most outstanding ministry during His passion and crucifixion. Our Lord is continuing His incredible works of mercy even while He is suffering. Some points, which illustrate this particular concern for others, include the following:

At the Last Supper, Peter professes his loyalty to Jesus. Jesus, for His part, knows that Peter and the others will abandon and betray Him. Nonetheless, He still shares the Eucharist with them (His very life) and prays for them. He even prays for Peter by name so that when Peter turns, that is repents and converts from his sinful denial, he would become a source of strength for the other disciples. It would certainly be difficult for us to do that for our friends if we knew they were about to betray, abandon, or deny us. Jesus loves His disciples to the end despite their sin and failure (see Lk 22:31–32).

When the guards come to arrest Him, one of Jesus' disciples cuts off the ear of one of the high priest's slaves. Jesus heals the injury of those who were about to arrest Him. He cares for those who suffered violence even as they are in the process of arresting Him and about to begin His trial (see Lk 22:51).

Notice, too, how Pilate sends Jesus to Herod for questioning. At the end of that scene Luke tells us that Herod and Pilate become friends with each other that very day, for before this they had been at enmity with each other. It is no accident that this reconciliation occurs through the encounter with Jesus. He heals a broken friendship between Pilate and Herod even as they are shuffling the Lord back and forth from one to the other as part of a sham trial (see Lk 23:12).

When Jesus is carrying His cross and meets the weeping women, He takes time to comfort them. Even while He is heavily burdened with the weight of the cross, our Lord is not so burdened that He cannot offer a consoling word to others (see Lk 23:27–29).

As He is on the cross, Jesus prays for the forgiveness of His persecutors. He had taught His disciples to pray for their enemies and to do good to those who hurt them in the Sermon on the Plain (see Lk 6:27-28). Now, He is showing us what love of one's enemy looks like in practice as He absolves His very executioners (see Lk 23:34).

While He is on the cross, He consoles the Good Thief who asks to be remembered when the Lord comes into his kingdom (see Lk 23:42). Jesus responds with the same generous mercy He exemplified each day of His life. What He gives the Good Thief is much more than what was asked. He said: "Today you will be with me in Paradise" (see Lk 23:43). Even as He dies, Jesus is reconciling a sinner to God and giving salvation to one who sought it (see Lk 23:39–43).

All of these details are particular to Luke's Gospel. Luke relates them to us because he wants us to see that Jesus' passion is a manifestation of our Lord's greatest mercy and love for the world.

- How do you treat others when you are having a bad day?
- What helps you to rise above your own concerns to address the needs of others?
- Which of the above interventions of Jesus strikes you as particularly meaningful and why?
- Who is willing to die for you?
- For whom are you willing to die?
- As you go through this Holy Week, how can you make time to bring your needs to the Lord and receive His ministry of mercy?
- Who needs to experience the mercy of Jesus through you this week?



What does Jesus' suffering have to do with the suffering in my life?

The Passion can seem like just a story of distant events in the past. The truth is that Jesus' Cross is deeply connected to our own crosses. In an article about St. Dismas, "the good thief," Colin MacIver explains.

I Am Dismas and So Are You

When I thought about and prayed with the story of Dismas as told in Luke's Gospel, a meditation on suffering grew in my interior life. It seems that I have spent my life hanging next to Christ. The doom of suffering unto death, in its varying levels of intensity, is mine. Because of sin, it is what I deserve. At the risk of escalating this too quickly, I'll just go right for it and say this: My sentence is death. I am terminal. So much around me tries to distract, numb, and deny a fact that remains: I will suffer, and I will die.

When I fail to numb that reality away and breathe in the ache of my mortality, I am left with two paths. One is to curse God, mock Christ, and rail on in my bitterness until I am finally silenced by death, like Gesmas (Gestas), "the bad thief." The other path is to look over at the bleeding and suffocating Christ beside me and to console his heart with an outcry of faith and repentance, like Dismas.

Crosses Change Everything

Scripture tells us nothing of the method of Dismas' crucifixion, but in my own meditative imagination, Dismas was nailed like Christ. In his final hours, as he pulled himself up by the nails to take a breath, he rose and fell on his cross in harmony with Christ. Dismas's wounds were conformed to those of Jesus, and the entire shape and meaning of his life was transformed.

I use this vision to sustain me in rough moments. When any given day is full of agony, I know that I do not hang on my cross alone, and I can turn my gaze to the one crucified next to me. I see that I deserve my cross, while he is innocent, and I can immediately perceive the way he is looking at me. His eyes are full of mercy. It changes everything.



Make It Your Own

Pray specifically with St. Luke's Passion narrative and put yourself in the place of St. Dismas. Write down what you want to say to Jesus crucified right next to you.

The Promise of Remembrance

Whether you are a daily Mass goer or do or deal drugs, whether you are suffering from a hangnail or a terminal illness, whether you are young or old, rich or poor—know this: You do not hang alone. If your cross is anxiety, unemployment, divorce, stress, poverty, chronic pain, or a slow internet connection ... you do not hang alone. Look next to you. Make eye contact with the one who is innocent and crucified. Rebuke the voices of complaint, bitterness, and despair and call on his mercy. I am Dismas and so are you. The whole lot of us face a terminal sentence. Nothing we buy, nothing we invent or do can keep us from our doom. We will all suffer, and we will all die, but this is not the last word; at least, it does not have to be.

Look into the eyes of Christ and pray this right now:

"Remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Luke 23:42

Can you hear the response? It is a promise, sealed in blood and agony, that you will be remembered. Count on it.

Ponder and Pray

- What are your current crosses, and how can you connect with Jesus' Passion in a particular way this Holy Week?
- How does your prayer life enter into a conversation with Jesus' crucifizion?
- What would you say to Jesus if you were hanging beside him?
