

Dear Parishioners,

Easter greetings to all of you! It is almost five years since we started walking together as a parish of Saint Francis of Assisi with me as your pastor. After the Bishops' Synod in Rome concluded and reading the final document, after consulting with the Pastoral Council, after much prayer and reflection, it seems good to us and to the Holy Spirit to hold a parish synod. We are calling our parish synod on Saturday September 27, 2025.

Our parish was dedicated on October 7, 1965, by the Most Rev. Bishop Robert J. Dwyer. This year we celebrate our 60th anniversary as a parish, which makes it a perfect time to pause our journey to come together to pray and reflect about our mission as a parish in the North Tahoe area.

What is a parish synod? The word synod comes from the Greek word "synodos", meaning "meeting" or "coming/walking together" (from syn-meaning "together" and hodos meaning "way" or "journey"). It is a local gathering within a Catholic parish where members of the community—clergy, laypeople, and sometimes religious—come together to pray, listen, discuss, and discern how the Holy Spirit is guiding their parish.

It is in this communal walk that we talk to each other to make sure that we are all walking to the same place and with the same destination in mind. The vision of the parish is, "To make manifest the Kingdom of God in North Lake Tahoe." We can ask ourselves: How do we make manifest God's Kingdom in our area?

Here, I am inviting all of you parishioners to join me in prayer and discernment, starting today until the day of the synod, that the Holy Spirit guides us and inspires us to see clearly where He wants us to go or what kind of ministry He wants us to strengthen in our parish. This is a strictly spiritual gathering, focusing on our spiritual well-being, unlike a coffee and donuts gathering or a business meeting to talk about projects.

I look forward to our first parish synod together. Please join me in honoring the memory of Pope Francis by taking the next step in building a more synodal church, one where we embrace our mission as we journey towards Christ.



## Is the Catholic faith calling to you?

## Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection Third Sunday of Easter May 4, 2025

The first half of this passage focuses on the work of redemption that will take place through the ministry of Peter as the Chief Fisherman of the Church. The role of Peter as leader in this effort is demonstrated as the one who initiates the effort (see Jn 21:3). The image of fishing was traditionally used in scripture to describe the missionary activity of the Church. It should be remembered that just prior to this passage Jesus had just sent the disciples on a mission (see Jn 20:21). Also, the image of a boat has been a symbol of the Church since the first Century (see Jn 21:3). Thus, this passage teaches us an important message about how the missionary activity of the Church will take place. Here are two of several elements in this passage to be considered:

- The disciples must follow the Lord's direction for their work to be successful (see Jn 21:5–6). When they act on their own, without seeking the Lord's direction and obediently following it, then their nets remain empty and their efforts fruitless.
- When the disciples are invited to the meal with Jesus we are told that they know it is the Lord because Jesus is revealed to them (see Jn 21:14). This revelation of Jesus in the context of a Eucharistic setting is similar to what the disciples experience on the journey to Emmaus in Luke when they, too, recognize Jesus in the Breaking of the Bread. The revelatory nature of this passage is central to its meaning. We were previously told in Jn 21:1 that Jesus would reveal Himself to His disciples. Then in Jn 21:7, we were told that the Beloved Disciple recognized Jesus as the one who spoke to them and directed their fishing efforts. It is important to note that the Beloved Disciple could only recognize Jesus through His Word when they had faithfully and obediently followed the Lord's direction and command (this sequence reinforces a larger theme in John's Gospel by which believing precedes revelation). Thus, the two revelatory moments of Jesus in this passage occur when our Lord speaks His Word and when He offers the Eucharistic meal. This passage teaches us how we, as disciples today, must learn to recognize Jesus revealing Himself to us in the scriptures we read (His Word) and in the Breaking of Bread (Eucharist). The proper response to this revelation is to enter into dialogue with Jesus.

The above elements teach us much about the work of the Church today as we strive to carry on the redeeming ministry of Jesus through missionary activity. It speaks to ministry leaders to remind them of the need to seek the Lord's guidance at all times and to follow it with the obedience of faith. It reminds us that the Sacraments and ministries of the Church are meant to have a transforming impact in people's lives effectively making them "Children of God" in word and deed and equal participants in the Eucharistic sharing of life. Finally, it reminds us that we have much work to do because none of it will happen unless we, like the disciples, become the Lord's instruments and allow Jesus to work in us and through us. It is that continuous prayerful cooperation with the Lord that makes us His disciples and Children of God.

- Which of these aspects of the redeeming missionary work of the Church speaks most challengingly and profoundly to you and why?
- Given this passage as a model for evangelization, in which effort does the Church need to put more attention and effort at this time?
- The disciples had to work together in the boat in order to realize this great and important work. What is your role in the boat of the Church when it comes to carrying out missionary or evangelization efforts?
- What can a faith community do to help its members recognize and respond to Jesus' self-revelation in Word and Sacrament?



## A SEASON FOR MIRACLES

## What are the top miracles in the Bible?

We recently asked readers to name their favorite miracles. More than one thousand responses arrived, and we've listed the top five here. Are these signs from God on your list of meaningful miracles, too?

#### 1. Resurrection



"Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." Luke 24:5

For Catholics, the Resurrection is the cornerstone of our Faith. It symbolizes the triumph of life over death and the promise of eternal salvation. And who wouldn't want to see a dead man rise and fulfill God's plan for humanity?

#### 2. Wedding at Cana



"The mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." John 2:3-4

The miracle at Cana is significant to Catholics because it marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. For his first miracle, Jesus turned water into wine. This episode also highlights the importance of Mary's intercession and her role as the Mother of God. That's a wedding we would all want to be guests at! It undoubtedly was an event to remember.

### 3. Transfiguration



"And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light. And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him."

Matthew 17:2-3

The Transfiguration foreshadows Jesus' Resurrection and the glory of the Kingdom of Heaven. The presence of Moses and Elijah signified the continuity between the Old and New Testaments. It also confirmed Jesus as the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. Can we blame Peter for wanting to set up some tents and hang out with these three holy men?

#### 4. Parting of the Red Sea



"Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided."

Exodus 14:21

The parting of the Red Sea is pivotal in salvation history, revealing God's absolute power. Imagine the liberation the Israelites must have felt at seeing this sea part in two. It reminds us that God keeps his promises and is faithful to his covenant. This miracle is quite a start to the journey toward the Promised Land!

#### 5. Raising Lazarus



"[Jesus] cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out.' The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with bandages, and his face wrapped with a cloth." John 11:43–44

This miracle reveals both Jesus' divinity and his humanity. Scripture says "Jesus wept" and shared in the sorrow of Lazarus' loved ones. The emergence of Lazarus from the tomb shows us that eternal life awaits all who believe in the one who raised the dead—Jesus.


