



# Bishop Mueggenborg's Gospel Reflection The Most Holy Trinity June 15, 2025

Our scripture passage comes from the Gospel of John 16:12–15. In this passage, Jesus informs the disciples that He has much more to tell them but that they cannot bear it now. The promised gift of the Holy Spirit will be the ongoing source of revelation and understanding for disciples.

The word Jesus uses for "bear" refers to a heavy weight that someone must carry. By using this term, Jesus is telling the disciples that there will be challenges in their future lives that will be quite heavy. They are asked to follow Jesus one day at a time and rely on the consoling strength of the Holy Spirit to guide them through the events that will inevitably take place. Their commitment to follow Him must be an act of faith that requires trust rather than an act of knowledge in which they are fully aware of the details and implications of their future lives. That is an important lesson for us especially when we experience fragility in our resolve or an overwhelming desire to know what challenges lay ahead.

Sometimes we are hesitant to accept responsibilities or tasks unless we fully understand the full scope of how those duties will impact our lives. When it comes to faith, such a prerequisite for our commitment will lead us to reject opportunities to follow the Lord because we don't know all the implications of that decision. Jesus asks us to commit our lives to Him without such foreknowledge or predictability. Our Lord does assure us that He will be with us in whatever trials come as a result of our discipleship. The challenge for us as disciples is to make an irrevocable commitment to God with our lives and not to insist that the Lord first reveal the details of all that He will ask of us.

- How has your life of faith unfolded in ways that have demanded unforeseen sacrifice from you?
- In calling us to be His disciples, Jesus is asking us to sign a blank check with our lives based on the trust that He will be with us no matter what happens. When have you given someone such a blank check with your life? What was that experience like?
- When have you given God a blank check and how has the Lord responded to that gift?

  How does your desire for certitude and knowledge lead you to decline opportunities for discipleship?
- When have you opened your life in an act of trusting commitment to the Lord and been overwhelmed by God's gratuitous providence and grace?



#### Are Catholics Christian?

This is a great question to ask on Trinity Sunday because the answer has to do with the central belief of Christianity: the Trinity. Michael Gormley explains the answer to this question in this adapted transcript from one of his Ascension Presents videos.

The answer is yes, Catholics are Christians. But what does it mean to be a Christian? That's an interesting question. A lot of confusion comes in when you talk to people whose denominations don't have a liturgical tradition. For example, if you take charismatics or Pentecostals into a Catholic Church with the smells, bells, robes, statues, and all the rest, the Liturgy often puts people off. They might say, "This doesn't seem Christian; it seems like witchcraft." But if you take a

The Trinity is uniquely Christian, and Jesus is no "one-calorie cola." Jesus is God, the real "thing." Lutheran, a Presbyterian, or an Anglican into the Catholic Mass, they're more likely to say, "Yeah, what's the big deal? It's liturgy."

So, what do we mean by "Christian"? First, people who call themselves Christian must believe in the Trinity. Jesus Christ—when he came in the fullness of time, "born of woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4)—says he revealed to us that he is the Son, and thus, he

revealed to us the Father. He promised us the Spirit of the Father and the Holy Spirit, which will reveal all things to us. The Trinity is uniquely Christian. Jesus fulfilled the Jewish monotheism but revealed the deeper hidden truth of the very nature of God as three Persons in one God. So all Christians have to believe in the Trinity.

Second, Christians must believe that the Word of God, the Second Person of the Trinity—God the Son—became flesh, took on a full human nature, and united it to his one Divine Personhood. He is fully human and fully divine. These are the basics of the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed. We pray these prayers that Jesus is "God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God." You cannot be a Christian if you do not believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God who, at one point in time, took onto himself a full human nature. Some religions say Jesus is not God, but in Scripture, he tells us he is God, and we Christians—we Catholics—believe him. He is no "one-calorie cola." Jesus is God, the real "thing."

We acknowledge not only that God, in his innermost mystery, is not alone; he's a communion of Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but also, the Second Person of the Trinity, the Son, entered into the human story. These are the things that true Christians believe.
